Game 5: vs. Northern Colorado



Montana hosts UNC Bears
in Homecoming & Big Sky Opener

THE GAME: The 6th/7th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies (2-2/0-0 BSC) open their Big Sky Conference season and play their annual Homecoming Game against the University of Northern Colorado Bears (1-2/0-0 BSC), Saturday, Sept. 27 in Washington-Grizzly Stadium (25,217). Kickoff is slated for 1:40 p.m. (Mountain).

GAME SPONSOR: The Griz-Bears game is sponsored by the *Missoula Federal Credit Union*.

SERIES/LAST MEETING: The Griz lead the series 12-1 and have won 12 in a row. The last meeting was a 40-17 win by Montana in Greeley in 2012. The Bears beat the Grizzlies 27-19 in Greeley in the teams' first meeting in 1976. (See adds 12 & 14 for more information).

GRIZ IN HOMECOMING GAMES IN WGS: Montana is 23-4 in Homecoming games since 1987 in Washington-Grizzly Stadium. The Griz and Bears have played in one Homecoming contest, UM winning 55-28 in 2011. UM has won 20 of its past 21 Homecoming games.

GRIZ RADIO: Mick Holien is in his 22nd season as the voice of Griz football and his 30th year overall. Scott Gurnsey is in his 17th year serving as the in-booth analyst, while Greg Sundberg is the sideline reporter for his fourth season. (FB Radio Network is on add 6).

TELEVISION/STREAMING: The game is on *ROOT Sports*, with Tom Glasgow calling the play-by-play, Jason Stiles is the analyst, and Jen Mueller is the sideline reporter. It can be seen on DirecTV channel 687; Dish channel 426; and Bresnan channels 560/60. **The game will not be streamed.**

LAST WEEK (At NDSU 22, Montana 10): Senior kicker Adam Keller connected on a school-record five field goals to lead the number-one ranked Bison to the win over the fourth-ranked Grizzlies in front of a loud and partisan crowd of 18,890 fans in NDSU's Gate City Bank Field at the Fargodome.

POW NOMINEES vs. NDSU: Offense: No nominee. **Defense:** Junior linebacker Jeremiah Kose (16 tackles, 10 unassisted). **Special Teams:** Junior punter Stephen Shaw (6 punts for a 44.0-yard average).

JOHNSON UPDATE: Senior QB Jordan Johnson is seventh in career passing yards with 6,331; fourth in career TD passes with 56; and he's tied for sixth in TDs responsible for with 60.

CANADA UPDATE: Senior halfback Jordan Canada's 2,496 career rushing yards rank him fourth on the career list. He is also ranked fourth with 30 career scoring runs.

HENDERSON UPDATE: Junior wide receiver Ellis Henderson is now 23rd in career receiving yards with 1,478, and he remains 10th in career receiving TDs with 16.

WAGENMANN UPDATE: Senior defensive end Zack Wagenmann is ranked fifth in career sacks with 26, and he is sixth in career tackles for loss with 36.

HERMANSON UPDATE: Senior free safety Matt Hermanson has moved up to 15th in the career tackles list with 274.

JJ PAYTON WATCH LIST UPDATE: Johnson, a 6-1, 195-pound senior from Eugene, Ore., and Walter Payton Award candidate, is 55-of-101-1 for 500 yards and 3 TDs so far this season.

WAGS BUCHANAN WATCH LIST UPDATE: Wagenmann, a 6-3 1/2, 255-pound senior defensive end and Buck Buchanan Award candidate from Missoula, Mont., has 25 tackles and 6.0 sacks this season. His 1.5 sacks a game ranks him eighth in the nation.

JOHNSON SEVENTH IN CAREER PASSING YARDS: With his 188 yards passing at NDSU, **Johnson** has 6,331 career passing yards which rank him seventh at Montana. He needs 374 yards to pass **John Edwards** for sixth (6,704, 1999-2002). Johnson, the eighth player in school history to throw for more than 6,000 yards, is now 21-8 as a starter.

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

Third Year at Montana: 17-11

Mick Delaney is 17-11 overall in his third season as the head coach at the University of Montana in his third year at UM.

The Grizzlies were 10-3 overall last season, and Coach Delaney was one of five finalists for the Liberty Mutual FCS “Coach of the Year.”

He is in his seventh season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM’s associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

The veteran mentor began his coaching career in 1964, and the 2014 season will be his 30th coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to UM from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007.

He has been coaching at Montana the past six seasons. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM’s associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

While coaching the Griz running backs he was instrumental in the success of Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11, as well as Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10 and currently plays for the St. Louis Rams.

Former (2003-09) Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, while former (2010-11) UM mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck’s staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation’s most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 1992. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

He began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under Jack Swarthout at UM from 1967-68, and was also the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-77) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the UM-Western Sports Hall of Fame. In 1972 he was named the Wrestling Coach of the Year by the Montana Coaches Association, and in 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He has been a member of the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

COACH DELANEY RADIO & TV SHOWS: The “**Mick Delaney Radio Show**” hosted by the “Voice of the Grizzlies,” **Mick Holien**, airs every Tuesday at 6:00 pm on Montana’s statewide Grizzly Football Radio Network. The show is hosted by Brooks & Brown, located in the Holiday Inn in downtown Missoula. The **Grizzly Sports Report** weekly TV show airs on ABC-FOX Montana. The half-hour show airs every Monday during the season, and begins at 9:30 p.m. (Mtn.) in Montana after the local news in Missoula, Billings, Bozeman, Butte, Great Falls, Helena, and Kalispell, and at 10:30 p.m. (Mtn.) on SWX in Spokane. It is hosted by ABC-FOX Sports Director **Dominic Shelden**, and features interviews with Coach Delaney and a player every week, as well as mic’d up segments featuring the Griz coaching staff at practice. It also airs every Friday at 4:30 pm (Mtn.) on **Altitude TV**.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

ON UNC GAME: “Coach (Ernest) Collins has done a really nice job, and his teams are getting better year-by-year and week-by-week. They’ve got a lot of new players from two years ago, which is the last time we played them. They’re getting better athletes, and they’re going to beat some people, and we can’t let that be us. We’ve got to prepare for them just like we did last week for North Dakota State and our three games before that one.

“The number one thing is that we’ve got to figure out a way to run the football against really good teams. We haven’t been able to do that yet, and we’ve got to figure out a way to get that done.

“There is still a lot of football to be played. Thank goodness there’s eight more (regular-season games left this season) opportunities for us. Every goal that we set as a team is still out there for us – the Big Sky championship; beat Montana State; the playoffs – those things are all still in front of us. It is not an easy road by any means. It’s a really, really tough road, especially with our schedule on the road towards the end of the season, but that’s what the Big Sky is about now. So, we’ve got to take in one game at a time; one play at a time; one whatever at a time; and just continue to stay focused and work hard, and good things will happen.”

ON NDSU GAME: “When you leave a game like that you’re always disappointed when you can’t get in done. When you have an opportunity to sit back and look at it, I am just so proud of our guys. We played very, very well defensively. They are not a team that you keep out of the end zone five times and force them into five field goals. That speaks very highly of our defense.

“Our guys did some really good things, even offensively, even though we struggled. Our youth is getting exposed a little sometimes. We’ve got work to do. Obviously we’ve put ourselves in a bind a little bit. Now we’ve got to play one week at a time and do what we can to try to run the table, and see what happens. You probably think I am crazy, but I’d love to play them (NDSU) again. They’re a great team. But when you watch our guys on tape, we’re pretty darn good too for the most part.”

SKY NOTES (by Jon Kasper, BSC)

THRILLER IN BOZEMAN: Eastern Washington won its 12th straight game over a Big Sky opponent in thrilling fashion, beating Montana State 52-51 last Saturday in Bozeman. It was a non-conference game between the long-time rivals. Montana State took a 51-44 lead with 1:55 to play when Dakota Prukop threw a 9-yard TD pass to Shawn Johnson. EWU drove 75 yards in nine plays in 1:28. The drive featured a 40-yard pass from Vernon Adams Jr. to Kendrick Bourne on a fourth-and-10. Mario Brown scored on a 1-yard run with 27 seconds left. Adams Jr. ran in a 2-point conversion for the game-winning points. The teams combined for 1,129 yards of total offense.

ADAMS INCHES CLOSER: Adams Jr. was held to a season-low two touchdown passes in the win over Montana State. Adams Jr. now has 93 career touchdown passes, just five shy of tying the Big Sky all-time record of 98 held by Weber State's Cameron Higgins.

HORNETS' HOT START: Sacramento State moved to 3-1 with a 59-14 home win over Menlo on Saturday. It's the first time since 1999 that a Hornet team has won three of their first four games. Jody Sears, Sacramento State's interim head coach, is just the second coach in school history to start his career 3-1.

JOHNSON AN ALL-AROUND GREAT GUY: Montana State senior running back Shawn Johnson amassed 374 all-purpose yards and three in the Bobcats' 52-51 loss to EWU. Johnson now has 3,519 career all-purpose yards, which ranks fourth in school history.

KEHANO CATCHING ON: After missing most of the past two seasons with injuries, Weber State senior wide receiver Shaydon Kehano is off to a monster start. Kehano ranks second in the nation with an average of 9.5 catches per game.

WALSH FOURTH ON WINS LIST: Cal Poly head coach Tim Walsh won his 81st game while coaching in the Big Sky last Saturday as his Mustangs beat his former team Portland State 42-14. Walsh now has 81 career victories, moving him into fourth place on the all-time win list.

EXTRA POINTS: Cal Poly rushed for 470 yards in its win over PSU...NAU safety Eddie Horn, a JC transfer, had a career-high 14 tackles in the Lumberjacks' loss to South Dakota. Defensive tackle Lexington Smith had three tackles for loss in Northern Colorado's loss to Northern Iowa...Southern Utah QB Aamon Olsen, a BYU transfer, started his first game against Fresno State and threw for 309 yards and two TDs...The Big Sky went 0-17 this season against FBC teams, marking the first time since 2010 the league failed to beat an FBS squad. It was also the last year a Big Sky team won a national championship.

MISSOULA, MONTANA— The Grizzlies turned on the afterburners in the third quarter to register A Homecoming victory over the visiting Bears. It was Montana's 19th Homecoming win in a row, dating back to 1993.

Leading 24-12 at halftime, the Grizzlies (3-2/2-1) scored 28 unanswered points in the third stanza to take a commanding 55-14 lead over the Bears (0-5/0-3).

Junior quarterback Gerald Kemp rushed for a 7-yard touchdown to open the scoring in the third period. He then threw a 19-yard touchdown pass to junior halfback Peter Nguyen, and then followed that up with another 7-yard scoring run, and the Griz led 48-14 with 4:42 remaining in the quarter.

It was a game of a lot of firsts by Griz players. Kemp had his first career rushing and passing touchdowns. Last season he mostly played running back out of the wildcat formation. It was also the first touchdown reception by Nguyen.

It was also the first (and only) start for junior quarterback Nate Montana, who threw a 39-yard scoring pass to Antwon Moutra on a flea-flicker on the Grizzlies' first play from scrimmage.

The Bears answered UM's opening score, though, as quarterback Seth Lobato connected with receiver Patrick Walker on a 7-yard TD pass with 5:55 left in the opening quarter.

Montana took the lead for good a couple of minutes later when senior kicker Brody McKnight nailed a 47-yard field goal, which gave the Griz a 10-7 first quarter lead.

The teams traded touchdowns after that via big plays on special teams. The Griz took a 17-7 lead when Jabin Sambrano scored on a 43-yard punt return. But seconds later UNC's Dominic Gunn returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown, which cut the UM lead to 17-14 with 9:36 left until intermission.

The Griz tacked on 10 more points prior to the half, as Kemp hit Moutra for a 32-yard scoring pass, and McKnight kicked a 27-yard field goal as time expired to give the Griz a 27-14 halftime lead.

Kemp rushed 11 times for a career-high 79 yards and two scores, and completed 7-of-8 passes for 112 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Junior halfback Dan Moore had eight carries for 43 yards, while redshirt freshman Jordan Canada added 41 yards on eight totes.

Montana completed 7-of-10 passes for 138 yards and a TD. Moutra had 71 receiving yards, and both of his catches resulted in touchdowns.

The Griz defense was stellar against the run, giving up 21 net yards on 24 carries, and sacked Lobato five times. UM senior linebackers Caleb McSurdy and Alex Shaw led the way with 8 and 7 tackles, respectively. Shaw also had two tackles for loss and a sack. The "D" racked up 12 tackles for loss.

Nguyen (164) and Sambrano (144) combined for 308 all-purpose yards.

Sobato was 30-of-46-1 for 252 yards and two TDs. Walker had 9 catches for 94 yards and a touchdown, while Morris had 7 grabs for 32 yards and a score. Bumpas had a game-high 14 tackles. Gunn had 215 all-purpose yards.

At WYOMING 17, MONTANA 12

LARAMIE, WYOMING – Montana gave Wyoming everything it wanted in the teams' 2014 opener and had to endure two long delays due to lightning strikes which lasted a total of 57 minutes, losing 17-12 to the FBS Cowboys in front of 25,243 fans in UW's Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium.

The game's second lightning strike delay came with 13:28 to play and lasted 32 minutes, while the first came with about 12 minutes remaining in the halftime break, and it took 25 minutes. The game lasted a total of four hours and three minutes.

The Griz made a run at the Cowboys late in the game, as quarterback Jordan Johnson threw a 16-yard TD pass to tight end Mike Ralston, cutting Wyoming's lead to 17-12. After the Johnson-to-Ralston TD hook-up, UM's two-point conversion try failed, and the Griz trailed by five points (17-12) with 8:20 left to play.

The Cowboys went ahead 10-6 and took the lead for good with 5:10 to go in the third quarter on a 5-yard scoring run by junior halfback Shaun Wick. Wyoming upped its lead to 17-6 with 2:11 to go in the third period, when halfback C.J. May scored on a 58-yard run.

UM took a 6-3 lead with 11:28 to go in that period on a 26-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Burke to fellow wide receiver Josh Janssen on an end-around play.

Janssen's first career catch and TD was set up by a sack and a forced fumble of UW quarterback Colby Kirkegaard by Griz defensive end Tyrone Holmes, and that fumble was recovered by tackle Trevor Rehm, giving UM possession on its own 36-yard line.

UW got on the board first and scored the only points in the opening quarter on their first possession, a 12-play, 57-yard drive that took 5:59, and culminated it with a 41-yard field goal by senior kicker Stuart Williams. That made the score 3-0 UW at 7:17 left in the first quarter.

Wyoming had a chance to regain the lead in the second stanza when Eric Nrzeocha blocked a punt by UM's Stephen Shaw, which was recovered by Brian Hill on Montana's 9-yard line with 2:09 to go until intermission. However the drive was halted when Griz junior linebacker Jeremiah Kose intercepted Kirkegaard's pass in the end zone.

Both defenses were stellar, as the Cowboys were limited to 301 total yards on 67 plays and the Grizzlies had 253 yards on 65 plays. Wyoming ended up with 17 first downs, to UM's 12.

The Cowboys rushed for 209 yards, while the Grizzlies gained 42. Wyoming had an edge in time of possession of 34:54 to 25:04.

Halfback/receiver Travon Van had a career-high 9 catches for 66 yards. Wide receiver Ellis Henderson had 5 catches for 48 yards.

Johnson completed 24-of 45 passes for 185 yards and one touchdown.

Linebacker Kendrick Van Ackeren led the Griz with a game and career-high 14 tackles, while safety Matt Hermanson had 11, and junior linebacker Herbert Gamboa added 10. Senior defensive end Zack Wagenmann added 2 sacks and 7 tackles. Kose also had 7 tackles along with a pick.

Kirkegaard was 13-21-1 for 92 yards. Wick rushed 15 times for 100 yards and a TD.

MISSOULA, MONTANA (9/6/14) – Running back Travon Van scored four touchdowns on just six touches to lead the Grizzlies over the visiting Central Washington Wildcats in a non-league contest in UM's 2014 home opener Saturday afternoon in Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Van scored on touchdown runs of 31, 9, and 43, and also scored on a 85-yard pass reception.

The Grizzlies (1-1) dominated from the out-set, scoring on five of their first six possessions. When Van hauled in the 85-yard pass from QB Shay Smithwick-Hann he upped Montana's lead to 31-7 with four minutes to go in the second quarter.

Montana jumped out to a 24-0 lead on Van's 9-yard touchdown run with 13:10 to go in the second stanza. The key play in that scoring drive was a 23-yard hoop-up between Smith-Hann and receiver Jamaal Jones, and a 44-yard run by halfback Jordan Canada.

The Griz scored 17 points in a row in the first quarter, starting with sophomore kicker Harrison Greenberg's 29-yard field goal. That was followed by Van's 31-yard scoring run, and then redshirt freshman linebacker Tucker Schye scooped up a fumble and raced into the end zone for 46 yards out to give UM a 17-0 lead with 4:10 to go in the first stanza.

CWU (0-1), a Division II team and member of the Great Northwest Athletic Conference, got on the board with 10:06 remaining in the second quarter on a 13-yard pass from quarterback Jake Nelson to wide-out Kent McKinney, making the score 24-7, UM.

Montana put the game out of reach with 22 seconds to go in the third quarter on a 22-yard run by halfback John Nguyen, which gave the home squad a 48-7 cushion. The Wildcats scored the final points of the game on a 22-yard run by running back Jordan Todd.

Canada led the Grizzlies' potent ground game with 15 carries for 96 yards. Van had just 3 totes for 83 yards, while Nguyen had 7 and rushed for 78 yards. Lorenzo Logwood, a true freshman from Oakland, Calif., made his UM debut today, and picked up 36 yards on 7 carries. Montana rushed 38 times for 298 yards and scored four TDs.

Smithwick-Hann was an efficient 10-of-16-0 for 145 yards and a TD, and was sacked just once. Smithwick-Hann got the start because fellow senior signal-caller Jordan Johnson was unable to play because of an injury.

Van had 3 catches for 70 yards, while Jones had 3 for 58. The Smithwick-Hann to Van 85-yard scoring pass was the fifth longest in school history.

Defensive end Zack Wagenman led the stingy Griz defense with 9 tackles and a sack. Junior defensive end Tyrone Holmes had 2.5 tackles for loss. Senior free safety Matt Hermanson had an interception – the sixth of his career. The Griz limited CWU to 56 yards rushing on 31 carries, and had 3 sacks.

Montana gave up just 273 total yards, and 117 of those came in the fourth quarter when the Griz defense was primarily playing with back-up players. Sixty-seven UM players saw action.

Nelson was 25-of-37-1 for 217 yards and one score. Excluding his 32-yard TD run, Todd had 14 carries for 27 yards. Senior receiver Greg Logan led CWU with game-highs of 9 catches for 92 yards. The Wildcats' top tackler was junior safety DeAndre Baines with 9 stops.

AT MONTANA 28, SOUTH DAKOTA 20

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The University of Montana’s Jordan Canada, Jordan Johnson, and Zack Wagenmann led the way as the Grizzlies defeated the University of South Dakota Coyotes 28-20 Saturday evening in front of a Washington-Grizzly Stadium record crowd of 26,303.

Canada rushed 16 times for 114 yards, while Johnson passed for 2 touchdowns, and Wagenmann led a solid effort by the entire “D” with 3 sacks.

The Grizzlies (2-1) led the entire game, and took a 21-10 lead when Johnson tossed a 14-yard scoring pass to Jamaal Jones with 2:22 left in that stanza.

The Coyotes (1-2) trimmed UM’s lead to 21-13 early in the fourth quarter (11:18) on a 29-yard field goal by Miles Bergner. But, the Griz regained a double-digit lead at 28-13 with 6:18 to go when halfback Travon Van broke loose for a 28-yard touchdown run.

USD got on the board with 1:50 left on a 31-yard TD pass from quarterback Ryan Saeger to Eric Shufford. The Coyotes’ subsequent on-side kick went out of bounds, and back-to-back runs by Canada secured a key first down, and UM ran out the clock for the victory.

UM scored the only points of the opening quarter on a 9-yard TD run by halfback John Nguyen with 39 seconds to go to take a 7-0 lead. USD cut the margin to 7-3 on a 35-yard field goal by Bergner with 3:18 to go in the second stanza, and that’s how the first half ended.

The Griz upped their lead to 14-3 with 11:45 to go in the third quarter on a 12-yard hook-up between Johnson and tight end Mitch Saylor. The Coyotes countered that TD with a 2-yard run by Jasper Sanders with 7:16 left in the third quarter, but that was followed by the Johnson-to-Jones touchdown pass.

Canada rushed 16 times for those 114 yards, averaging 7.1 per attempt. Van had 12 totes for 59 yards, while Nguyen had 6 carries for 34 yards.

Johnson was 16-of-27-0 for 127 yards and the two touchdown passes. Jones had team-highs of 6 catches for 62 yards.

Wagenmann had 6 tackles to go with his 3 sacks. Senior free safety Matt Hermanson and junior linebacker Kendrick Van Ackeren each had a game-high 9 tackles, and Hermanson had his second interception in the last two weeks. UM senior tackle Trevor Rehm added 7 stops. UM’s defense held USD’s vaunted running attack to 134 yards on 37 attempts – 3.6-yard average per rush.

Saeger was 16-of-25-2 for 183 yards and a TD. Tight end Aaron Ramsey led USD with 5 receptions for 76 yards, while Jasper rushed 12 times for 74 yards and a score. Cornerback Mike Lilly had a team-high 8 tackles for the Coyotes.

The Griz eclipsed the former WGS attendance record of 26,293, set last year in the season and home opener against Appalachian State.

FARGO, N.D. - Senior kicker Adam Keller connected on a school-record five field goals to lead the number-one ranked Bison to the win over the fourth-ranked Grizzlies Saturday afternoon in front of a loud and partisan crowd of 18,890 fans in NDSU's Gate City Bank Field at the Fargodome.

NDSU, the three-time defending FCS national champion, extended its record winning streak in the division to 28 with the victory.

The Bison (4-0) tacked on three insurance points late in the game (1:43 left), when Keller kicked his record-setting fifth field goal.

NDSU took a 19-10 lead on a 3-yard scoring pass from junior quarterback Carson Wentz to senior tight end Kevin Vaadeland at the 8:22 mark of the third quarter, and that's how the third stanza ended.

Montana (2-2) had reduced the NDSU lead to 12-10 with 52 seconds to go until halftime on a 20-yard field goal by junior kicker Daniel Sullivan - his first career three-pointer for the Griz. The score at intermission was 12-10, Bison.

When Keller connected on his fourth field goal of the game, a 47 yarder, he gave NDSU a 12-7 lead, and scored all of the points the Bison would need for the win with 5:34 left in the second quarter.

The Griz shaved the Bison lead to 9-7 with 10:01 left until intermission on a 3-yard run by senior halfback Jordan Canada. The big play which led to Canada's rushing touchdown was a 72-yard pass from senior quarterback Jordan Johnson to junior wide receiver Jamaal Jones, as Jones advanced the ball to the NDSU 3-yard line. That 72-yard Johnson-to-Jones pass completion tied for the 13th longest in school history.

NDSU took its first two-score lead (9-0) on a 32-yard field goal by Keller with 10:42 remaining until halftime. The Bison had taken a 6-0 lead in the opening quarter on back-to-back field goals by Keller, as he connected from 22 and 41 yards out. His two three-pointers accounted for the only scoring in the opening stanza.

Johnson was 15-of-29-1 for 188 yards with no scoring throws. Johnson was intercepted for the first time this season, which was also the Grizzlies' first turnover of the season.

Canada had 12 carries for 48 yards and a TD. Senior running back/wide-out Travon Van and junior wide receiver Ellis Henderson had a team-high 4 receptions each.

Junior linebacker Jeremiah Kose led the Griz with a game and career-high 16 tackles. Kendrick Van Ackeren garnered 13 tackles for UM, while fellow junior linebacker Herbert Gamboa added 11 stops, as did senior free safety Matt Hermanson.

Henderson now has 1,478 career receiving yards, moving him up to 24th in school history. Hermanson now has 274 career tackles, which moves him up to 15th on the all-time list.

Wentz was 16-of-24-0 for 167 yards and a TD. Senior running back John Crockett rushed 28 times for 144 yards. Vaadeland led NDSU with 5 catches.

The Bison out-gained the Griz 280 to 68 yards rushing, and had 24 first downs, compared to UM's nine. NDSU had almost 20 more minutes of possession than Montana (39:06 to 20:54).
