Game 3: vs. South Dakota



Montana hosts USD Coyotes Sept. 13th

THE GAME: The 4th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies (1-1) play their second home game in a row, Saturday, Sept. 13 hosting the University of South Dakota Coyotes (1-1) in Washington-Grizzly Stadium (25,217). Kickoff is at 7:07 p.m.

GAME SPONSOR: The Griz-USD game is sponsored by *Northwestern Energy*.

SERIES/LAST MEETING: The Griz lead 11-6, and have the last four in a row. Last season **Ellis Henderson** scored on a 98-yard kickoff return with 1:36 remaining in the game to give the 10th-ranked Grizzlies a hard-fought 31-27 non-league road victory over the Coyotes. *(More info on the series and USD on add 17 of this release).*

GRIZ RADIO: **Mick Holien** is in his 22nd season as the voice of Griz football and his 30th year overall. **Scott Gurnsey** is in his 17th year serving as the in-booth analyst, while **Greg Sundberg** is the sideline reporter for his fourth season. *(FB Radio Network is on add 6).*

TELEVISION: The Grizzly-Coyote game will be televised by Cowles Montana Media stations. **Ron Davis** calls the play-by-play, **Grady Bennett** serves as the analyst, and **Shaun Rainey** is the sideline reporter. It is available on Charter channels 10/510; DirecTV channel 24, and Dish Network channel 17.

LAST WEEK (at Montana 48, C. Washington 14): Senior running back **Travon Van** scored four touchdowns on just six touches to lead the Grizzlies in a non-league contest in UM's 2014 home opener. **Van** scored on touchdown runs of 31, 9, and 43, and also scored on a 85-yard pass reception. *(Game stats and recap on add 16).*

POW NOMINEES vs. CWU: **Van** was the nominee on offense; defensive end **Zack Wagenmann** was the defensive pick; and junior punter **Stephen Shaw** was the special teams nominee. **Shaw** averaged 44.8 yards a punt and had three inside the 20-yard line.

CANADA UPDATE: **Canada's** 2,238 career rushing yards keeps him up to fourth on the career list. He is also ranked fourth with 29 career scoring runs.

JOHNSON UPDATE: **Johnson** is now eighth in career passing yards with 6,016. He remains fifth in career touchdown throws with 54.

HENDERSON UPDATE: **Henderson** is 27th in career receiving yards with 1,420, and he's ranked 10th in career receiving TDs with 16.

WAGENMANN UPDATE: **Wagenmann** has moved up to seventh in career sacks with 23, and is also seventh in career tackles for loss with 33.

JJ PAYTON WATCH LIST UPDATE: **Johnson**, a 6-1, 195-pound senior from Eugene, Ore., was 24-of-45-0 for 185 yards and a TD, and rushed four times for 13 yards in UM's opener at Wyoming. He did not play last Saturday against CWU due to an injury.

WAGS BUCHANAN WATCH LIST UPDATE: **Wagenmann**, a 6-3 1/2, 255-pound senior defensive end from Missoula, had 9 tackles, a sack, and 1.5 TFLs in the win over CWU.

KIDDER OUT FOR THE SEASON: Defensive tackle **Caleb Kidder**, a 6-5, 275-pound junior from Helena, will miss the 2014 season due to an injury. **Kidder**, a UM honors candidate this season, was the Grizzlies fourth leading returning tackler with 40 stops a year ago.

JOHNSON EIGHTH IN CAREER PASSING YARDS: With his 185 yards passing at Wyoming two weeks ago, **Johnson** moved up to eighth in career passing yards at Montana with 6,016, passing **Drew Miller**, who threw for 5,900 yards in two seasons in 1999 and 2000. **Johnson, who is 20-7** as a starter, needs 68 more yards to pass **Marty Mornhinweg** for seventh.

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

Third Year at Montana: 16-10

Mick Delaney is 16-10 overall in two seasons as the head coach at the University of Montana in his third year at UM.

The Grizzlies were 10-3 overall last season, and Coach Delaney was one of five finalists for the Liberty Mutual FCS “Coach of the Year.”

He is in his seventh season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM’s associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

The veteran mentor began his coaching career in 1964, and the 2014 season will be his 30th coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to UM from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007.

He has been coaching at Montana the past six seasons. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM’s associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

While coaching the Griz running backs he was instrumental in the success of Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11, as well as Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10 and currently plays for the St. Louis Rams.

Former (2003-09) Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, while former (2010-11) UM mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck’s staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation’s most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 1992. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

He began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under Jack Swarthout at UM from 1967-68, and was also the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-77) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the UM-Western Sports Hall of Fame. In 1972 he was named the Wrestling Coach of the Year by the Montana Coaches Association, and in 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He has been a member of the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

COACH DELANEY RADIO & TV SHOWS: The “**Mick Delaney Radio Show**” hosted by the “Voice of the Grizzlies,” **Mick Holien**, airs every Tuesday at 6:00 pm on Montana’s statewide Grizzly Football Radio Network. The show is hosted by Brooks & Brown, located in the Holiday Inn in downtown Missoula.

The **Grizzly Sports Report** weekly TV show airs on ABC-FOX Montana. The half-hour show airs every Monday during the season, and begins at 9:30 p.m. (Mtn.) in Montana after the local news in Missoula, Billings, Bozeman, Butte, Great Falls, Helena, and Kalispell, and at 10:30 p.m. (Mtn.) on SWX in Spokane. It is hosted by ABC-FOX Sports Director **Dominic Sheldon**, and features interviews with Coach Delaney and a player every week, as well as mic’d up segments featuring the Griz coaching staff at practice. It also airs every Friday at 4:30 pm (Mtn.) on **Altitude**.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

ON USD THIS SATURDAY: “South Dakota is a good football team. They got ambushed by Oregon (62-13 loss in Eugene), but they still ran the ball well (USD had 168 yards rushing and had the ball for 39:04 against Oregon). They’ve got three quality running backs.

“Their quarterback (junior Kevin Earl) got hurt against Oregon, so they are going with Ryan Saeger (a 6-4, 225-pound sophomore), and he is a very, very good athlete. He’s a big, strong kid who runs and throws well. We anticipate this to be a barn-burner. I am glad we are playing this one at home.

“Joe (USD head coach Joe Glenn) told me some time after our last game that it might have been one of the worst defeats in his coaching career. He really took that one hard, so I know that he is going to be geared up and has pointed back at that game ever since it happened last year.

“Being so well-know in Missoula (he was UM’s head coach from 2000-02, going 39-6, and an assistant coach for the Griz from 1980-85), and being such a great person in this community for so many years on two different occasions, he’ll come here, I think, with a little bit of extra competitiveness, because it’s an important game for him, and obviously it’s also really an important game for us.”

ON THE GRIZ: “The real positive last week was that we were able to run the ball, and we’ve got to continue to do that. Shay came in and really did a nice job of managing the game; threw the ball very well, and did a great job of getting us into the right play numerous times. We had five three-and-outs to start the game on defense, so that was a real plus too.

“However we had one series that we missed tackles, and we had a few penalties and they scored, and we’d like to be a little more consistent and not have those ups and downs. I thought our kicking game was a real plus last week. The penalties we had were a real negative. We need to be just more consistent on both sides of the ball.”

ON CWU GAME: “Central Washington is a quality Division II program. Our guys came out really focused last Saturday. We made a strong effort last week that we were going to run the football better, and we did that, and we’ve got to continue to put emphasis on that in our offense.”

VA SHINES IN SEATTLE: For the second straight year, Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams Jr. put up huge numbers against a Pac-12 team, passing for 475 yards and seven touchdowns, as the Eagles fell to Washington 59-52.

HEAD TURNERS: Neither Weber State or Northern Colorado picked up victories last Saturday, but the results were encouraging. Weber State, which won two games last season, fell at home to No. 1 North Dakota State 24-7. The Wildcats trailed 14-7 at the half, and held the Bison run game to just 177 total yards. Weber State's defense intercepted two passes. Northern Colorado nearly ended its 11-game losing streak with an upset of UNLV of the Mountain West, as the Rebels held on for a 13-12 victory.

BUBBA'S FIRST WIN: North Dakota edged Robert Morris of the Northeast Conference 16-13 on Saturday night to give first-year head coach Bubba Schweigert his first victory. UND freshman Reid Taubenheim made field goals of 20, 45 and 35 yards. North Dakota blocked three kicks, including two field goals in the second half. UND has now won 28 consecutive home openers.

EWU's Cooper Kupp hauled in three TD passes in the loss to Washington, and now has 25 TD catches in 17 games....Sacramento State's Garrett Safron scored on a 73-yard run in a loss to Cal...PSU's Shaquille Richard rushed 14 times for a career-high 151 yards and a touchdown in a 45-38 win over Western Oregon. PSU's defense amassed 14 tackles for loss and seven sacks in the win...The Big Sky is now 0-14 this season against FBS teams...NAU QB Kyren Poe completed 31-of-42 passes for 293 yards and a touchdown in NAU's 27-21 win over Abilene Christian.

VERMILLION, S.D. - Ellis Henderson scored on a 98-yard kickoff return with 1:36 remaining in the game to give the 10th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies an emotional, hard-fought 31-27 non-league victory over the Coyotes.

With the win the Griz kept their FCS playoff hopes very much alive and improved to 8-2 overall. The Coyotes, who are coached by former UM mentor Joe Glenn, are much better than their 4-6 overall record indicates.

Montana has won three of its last four games on dramatic, last-second touchdowns. The Griz won 51-48 in overtime at Sacramento State, while three weeks ago they defeated visiting Cal Poly 21-14 in OT.

USD had regained the lead at 27-24 with 1:48 to go on a 38-yard field goal by freshman kicker Miles Bergner.

The first tie of the game came on a big play by Montana with 6:33 left to play, when USD freshman halfback Trevor Bouma was tackled by senior linebacker Jordan Tripp and the ball popped into the air and bounced into the arms of junior free safety Matt Hermanson who returned it 35 yards for a TD. Hermanson's (from Sioux Falls, S.D.) huge take-away tied the game at 24-24.

The teams combined for 41 first-half points, but the defenses dominated the third quarter, as neither teams could muster any points.

Henderson had 4 catches for a career-high 188 yards and 2 TDs and 315 all-purpose yards. Griz tight end Clay Pierson added 4 grabs, while wide-outs Cam Warren and Jamaal Jones had 3 catches each. Henderson's 98-yard kickoff return ties him for the second longest in UM history with former wide receiver Marc Mariani who had a 98-yarder against South Dakota State in 2009.

Griz quarterback Jordan Johnson was 17-of-33-3 passing for 337 yards and 2 TDs. He had thrown just one pick in UM's previous nine games.

The Griz "D" once again made key plays late in the game, especially when they held the Coyotes to that late field goal considering USD had a first-and-10 on the Grizzlies' 27-yard line in the final minutes of the game. That fourth quarter field goal by USD was its only points in the second half.

Hermanson led UM with a game-high 11 tackles, and also forced a fumble. Tripp had 9 tackles; cornerback Josh Dennard had 8 stops; defensive tackle Alex Bienemann added 7.

Montana took its first lead of the game on a 71-yard pass from Johnson to Henderson with 13:26 left in the second quarter. But, USD quickly regained the lead on its next possession when QB Kevin Earl threw a 2-yard TD pass to Josh Vander Maten, making the score 21-14 Coyotes with 9:22 to go in the second quarter. USD then went ahead 24-17 on a 21-yard field goal by Bergner as time expired in the half.

USD took an early (14:05 in the first quarter) 7-0 lead when free safety Aaron Swift picked off a Johnson pass and returned it 60 yards for a touchdown. UM cut the USD lead to 7-3 on a 46-yard field goal by Ben Worst, making the score 7-3 with 10:05 left in the opening quarter.

USD took a 14-3 lead with 6:30 to go on a 38-yard run by Bouma with 6:30 remaining in the first stanza. The Griz came right back, though, as Johnson hit Henderson for a 6-yard TD pass with 4:34 left in the first quarter. The big play of UM's score was set up by a 67-yard completion from Johnson to Henderson.

Earl was 27-of-45-0 for 235 yards and a TD. Bouma rushed 25 times for 147 yards and a TD.

At WYOMING 17, MONTANA 12

LARAMIE, WYOMING – Montana gave Wyoming everything it wanted in the teams' 2014 opener and had to endure two long delays due to lightning strikes which lasted a total of 57 minutes, losing 17-12 to the FBS Cowboys in front of 25,243 fans in UW's Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium.

The game's second lightning strike delay came with 13:28 to play and lasted 32 minutes, while the first came with about 12 minutes remaining in the halftime break, and it took 25 minutes. The game lasted a total of four hours and three minutes.

The Griz made a run at the Cowboys late in the game, as quarterback Jordan Johnson threw a 16-yard TD pass to tight end Mike Ralston, cutting Wyoming's lead to 17-12. After the Johnson-to-Ralston TD hook-up, UM's two-point conversion try failed, and the Griz trailed by five points (17-12) with 8:20 left to play.

The Cowboys went ahead 10-6 and took the lead for good with 5:10 to go in the third quarter on a 5-yard scoring run by junior halfback Shaun Wick. Wyoming upped its lead to 17-6 with 2:11 to go in the third period, when halfback C.J. May scored on a 58-yard run.

UM took a 6-3 lead with 11:28 to go in that period on a 26-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Burke to fellow wide receiver Josh Janssen on an end-around play.

Janssen's first career catch and TD was set up by a sack and a forced fumble of UW quarterback Colby Kirkegaard by Griz defensive end Tyrone Holmes, and that fumble was recovered by tackle Trevor Rehm, giving UM possession on its own 36-yard line.

UW got on the board first and scored the only points in the opening quarter on their first possession, a 12-play, 57-yard drive that took 5:59, and culminated it with a 41-yard field goal by senior kicker Stuart Williams. That made the score 3-0 UW at 7:17 left in the first quarter.

Wyoming had a chance to regain the lead in the second stanza when Eric Nrzeocha blocked a punt by UM's Stephen Shaw, which was recovered by Brian Hill on Montana's 9-yard line with 2:09 to go until intermission. However the drive was halted when Griz junior linebacker Jeremiah Kose intercepted Kirkegaard's pass in the end zone.

Both defenses were stellar, as the Cowboys were limited to 301 total yards on 67 plays and the Grizzlies had 253 yards on 65 plays. Wyoming ended up with 17 first downs, to UM's 12.

The Cowboys rushed for 209 yards, while the Grizzlies gained 42. Wyoming had an edge in time of possession of 34:54 to 25:04.

Halfback/receiver Travon Van had a career-high 9 catches for 66 yards. Wide receiver Ellis Henderson had 5 catches for 48 yards.

Johnson completed 24-of 45 passes for 185 yards and one touchdown.

Linebacker Kendrick Van Ackeren led the Griz with a game and career-high 14 tackles, while safety Matt Hermanson had 11, and junior linebacker Herbert Gamboa added 10. Senior defensive end Zack Wagenmann added 2 sacks and 7 tackles. Kose also had 7 tackles along with a pick.

Kirkegaard was 13-21-1 for 92 yards. Wick rushed 15 times for 100 yards and a TD.

MISSOULA, MONTANA (9/6/14) – Running back Travon Van scored four touchdowns on just six touches to lead the Grizzlies over the visiting Central Washington Wildcats in a non-league contest in UM's 2014 home opener Saturday afternoon in Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Van scored on touchdown runs of 31, 9, and 43, and also scored on a 85-yard pass reception.

The Grizzlies (1-1) dominated from the out-set, scoring on five of their first six possessions. When Van hauled in the 85-yard pass from QB Shay Smithwick-Hann he upped Montana's lead to 31-7 with four minutes to go in the second quarter.

Montana jumped out to a 24-0 lead on Van's 9-yard touchdown run with 13:10 to go in the second stanza. The key play in that scoring drive was a 23-yard hoop-up between Smith-Hann and receiver Jamaal Jones, and a 44-yard run by halfback Jordan Canada.

The Griz scored 17 points in a row in the first quarter, starting with sophomore kicker Harrison Greenberg's 29-yard field goal. That was followed by Van's 31-yard scoring run, and then redshirt freshman linebacker Tucker Schye scooped up a fumble and raced into the end zone for 46 yards out to give UM a 17-0 lead with 4:10 to go in the first stanza.

CWU (0-1), a Division II team and member of the Great Northwest Athletic Conference, got on the board with 10:06 remaining in the second quarter on a 13-yard pass from quarterback Jake Nelson to wide-out Kent McKinney, making the score 24-7, UM.

Montana put the game out of reach with 22 seconds to go in the third quarter on a 22-yard run by halfback John Nguyen, which gave the home squad a 48-7 cushion. The Wildcats scored the final points of the game on a 22-yard run by running back Jordan Todd.

Canada led the Grizzlies' potent ground game with 15 carries for 96 yards. Van had just 3 totes for 83 yards, while Nguyen had 7 and rushed for 78 yards. Lorenzo Logwood, a true freshman from Oakland, Calif., made his UM debut today, and picked up 36 yards on 7 carries. Montana rushed 38 times for 298 yards and scored four TDs.

Smithwick-Hann was an efficient 10-of-16-0 for 145 yards and a TD, and was sacked just once. Smithwick-Hann got the start because fellow senior signal-caller Jordan Johnson was unable to play because of an injury.

Van had 3 catches for 70 yards, while Jones had 3 for 58. The Smithwick-Hann to Van 85-yard scoring pass was the fifth longest in school history.

Defensive end Zack Wagenman led the stingy Griz defense with 9 tackles and a sack. Junior defensive end Tyrone Holmes had 2.5 tackles for loss. Senior free safety Matt Hermanson had an interception – the sixth of his career. The Griz limited CWU to 56 yards rushing on 31 carries, and had 3 sacks.

Montana gave up just 273 total yards, and 117 of those came in the fourth quarter when the Griz defense was primarily playing with back-up players. Sixty-seven UM players saw action.

Nelson was 25-of-37-1 for 217 yards and one score. Excluding his 32-yard TD run, Todd had 14 carries for 27 yards. Senior receiver Greg Logan led CWU with game-highs of 9 catches for 92 yards. The Wildcats' top tackler was junior safety DeAndre Baines with 9 stops.
