Griz host OPSU on Sept. 21st in annual "Hall of Fame Game"

THE GAME: The 9th/11th-ranked (*The Sports Network & FCS Coaches' polls*) University of Montana Grizzlies (2-0/0-0 Big Sky Conference) host the Oklahoma Panhandle State Aggies (1-2) in a non-league contest in UM's annual "Hall of Fame" game, Saturday, Sept. 21, in Washington-Grizzly Stadium, with kick-off at 1:00 p.m.

HALL OF FAME: This year's inductees into the *Grizzly Sports Hall of Fame* are UM's 1972 Big Sky champion men's track team, and former (1994-97) women's soccer standout **Courtney (Mathieson) Jenkins**. They will be formally inducted at a banquet Friday, Sept. 20, and will be introduced on the field prior to this Saturday's game.

GRIZ RADIO: Veteran **Mick Holien** is now in his 21st season as the "Voice of the Grizzlies." Former Griz (1991-94) wide receiver **Scott Gurnsey** provides in-booth color, while **Greg Sundberg** serves as the sideline reporter. UM's flagship station is KGVO Radio, 1290 AM/KVWE 101.5 FM. (*Grizzly Football Radio Network listed on add 2-2-2 of the weekly release*).

TV: The UM-OPSU game will be televised by **Max Media of Montana**. **Ron Davis** calls the play-by-play, **John Edwards** provides in-booth color, and **Shaun Rainey** is the sideline reporter. It will be aired on KTMF-FOX 23 & 42 in Missoula/Kalispell; KWYB-FOX 18 & 28 in Butte/Bozeman; KFBB-FOX 5 in Great Falls; KHBB-FOX 5 in Helena; KULR-NBC 8 in Billings; and KXGN-NBC in Glendive.

LAST GAME: The Griz had a dominant 55-17 victory at North Dakota. Trailing 7-0 early, UM scored on its first five possessions to take a commanding 33-7 lead en route to the victory.

JJ SETS BIG SKY RECORD: Junior quarterback **Jordan Johnson** was 15-19-1 (78.9%) passing for 354 yards and 5 touchdowns, setting a Big Sky Conference record in passing efficiency in a game at 322.3. The old record of 310.4 (10-14-0 for 265 yards and 4 TDs) was held by Eastern Washington's Mark Tenneson against Sonoma State and set in 1992.

JOHNSON HAS CAREER NIGHT AT UND & PASSES MILESTONE: Johnson's 354 passing yards against UND was a career-high for him. He now has 3,049 career passing yards, becoming the 12th player in school history to pass for more than 3,000 yards.

CANADA HITS CENTURY MARK AGAIN: Junior running back **Jordan Canada** rushed for 104 yards in the UND win -- his second 100-yard game this season and the fourth in his career.

D STELLAR: UM's defense held UND to 336 total yards and picked off two passes. Junior defensive end **Zack Wagenmann** had 6 tackles, 3 TFLs and 2 sacks. LB **Brock Coyle** had a game-high 9 tackles, while junior safety **Matt Hermanson** and LB **Jordan Tripp** had 7 stops apiece. **Tripp** and cornerback **Nate Harris** each had an interception. The Griz had five sacks and 11 stops for loss in the game.

TALK ABOUT EFFICIENCY!: UM converted on 9-of-10 third downs at UND. On the season Montana has converted on 72% (18-of-25) of their third down attempts, which leads the nation.

JJ NAMED POW: **Johnson** was named the Big Sky "Player of the Week" on offense for his performance last Saturday. **Wagenmann** was UM's nominee on defense.

ABOUT THE OPPONENT: OPSU is a Division II Independent team located in Goodwell, Oklahoma, and has an enrollment of 1,400. The Aggies are currently 1-2 overall, with a 75-0 loss at Lamar, a 35-13 win over Sterling College, and a 26-10 loss to Adams State. OPSU returns 11 starters from a 4-6 team of a year ago. Head coach Russell Gaskamp (Texas, 1999) is in his second season as the head coach there. **SERIES:** This is the first meeting between the teams.

NEXT WEEK: Montana begins its Big Sky schedule at Northern Arizona in a game which will be televised by *ROOT Sports*. Kickoff is at 6:00 p.m. in Flagstaff.

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY**Second Year at Montana (7-6)**

Mick Delaney has a record of 7-6 in his second season as the head football coach at the University of Montana.

He is in his sixth season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM's associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

Delaney coached Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11. He was also instrumental in the development of running back Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10.

A veteran mentor, Delaney began his coaching career in 1964. The 2013 season is his 29th season of coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to Montana from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007. Former Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, and former mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck's staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation's most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 92. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

Delaney began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach. He also taught English at Central.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under former UM head coach Jack Swarhout from 1968-69. He was the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time as well.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-76) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He was an assistant coach on Lubick's staff at Montana State from 1979-80.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western (Western Montana College) in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the Western Montana College Sports Hall of Fame and was honored by the Montana Coaches Association in 1972 as the Wrestling Coach of the Year. In 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He also belonged to many associations during his athletic career including the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

TV SHOW: The **Grizzly Sports Report** weekly television show airs on ABC-FOX Montana. The half-hour show airs every Monday during the season, and begins at 9:35 on FOX Montana after the local news in Missoula, Kalispell, Butte, Bozeman, Helena, and Great Falls. It is hosted by ABC-FOX Sports Director **Dominic Sheldon**, and features interviews with different players every week, and of course **Head Coach Mick Delaney**. The Coach's Show also airs every Friday at 4:30 pm MT on **Altitude**.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY:

ON OPSU: "It's a positive start, but it is also an odd start. In all honesty, we don't know a lot about Oklahoma Panhandle State. They've played Sterling, they've played Lamar, and they've played Adams State of Colorado. They beat Sterling (35-13), lost huge (75-0) to Lamar, and then lost (26-10) this past weekend to Adams State.

"They're a program that probably is competitive at their level. Our message to our guys is that it does not matter who we are playing – it's about us preparing the same every week, we do not want to be an up and down team. It's early, but I feel like we've got better from week one, to the bye week, to last Saturday. I think our team has improved in a lot of areas, but we still have a lot of work to do."

ON THE GRIZ: "I think we have a chance to be a really good football team. If we can continue to focus and work as hard as we have, and stay in the moment and not get ahead of ourselves, we can do some really special things."

ON UND GAME: "I think we probably surprised everybody but our players. They were so well prepared by our coaching staff, and they went in and executed the game plan to a tee.

"Physically we really felt before the (UND) game that it would be a real challenge up front on both sides of the ball. It was crucial for our defensive front to get pressure on their quarterback and our offensive line had to establish themselves against their big and experienced D-line. I thought that we dominated both of those match-ups from start to finish."

at MONTANA 30, APPALACHIAN STATE 6

MISSOULA, MONTANA (8/31/13) – Two of the premier teams in FCS football squared off, and the University of Montana Grizzlies came away with an impressive 30-6 victory over the Appalachian State Mountaineers in front of a record crowd of 26,293 in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium. It was the first ever regular-season night game in UM's stadium.

It was an impressive debut for the 20th-ranked Grizzlies, who racked up almost 500 yards of offense against a Mountaineers team (which had 328 total yards) that was 8-4 last season and returned 18 starters. ASU is making the move to the FBS next season, and because of that is not eligible for the FCS playoffs in 2013.

It was the first regular-season game under the lights for the Grizzlies, who jumped out to a 16-3 lead after an impressive first half in which they out-gained the 12th-ranked Mountaineers 272 total yards to 138, and had controlled the ball almost twice as much (19:05 to 10:55) time.

Montana took a 16-0 lead when junior quarterback Jordan Johnson connected with sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson on a 6-yard scoring pass, followed by junior running back Travon Van's 2-yard scoring run, and then a 25-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Chris Lider.

ASU finally got on the board when it marched 54 yards on five plays in the closing minutes of the second quarter, as senior place-kicker Drew Stewart nailed a 48-yard field goal as time expired at halftime.

Stewart cut the Griz advantage to 16-6 with a 21-yard field goal with 9:54 to go in the third quarter – which proved to be the only points scored by either squad in that stanza.

Montana, which is now 3-0 at home (and 3-1 overall) against ASU, tacked on two more touchdowns, the first on a 1-yard run by halfback Jordan Canada, and the second an 11-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper. Harper's TD, which were the final points scored in the game, came with 9:23 left to play.

Van's first game at Montana was a stellar one, as the transfer from Marshall rushed 20 times for 118 yards and a score, while Canada was just as outstanding, picking up 112 yards and a TD on 25 totes. Montana rushed 52 times for 246 yards and two scores.

Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson was a very competent 19-of-23-0 (82.6%) passing for 251 yards and two touchdowns.

Sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones, a transfer from Washington, had a team-high 6 catches for 60 yards, while Henderson had 3 grabs for 72 yards and a TD.

UM's defense, which held ASU to no touchdowns, was led by its three senior linebackers, J.P. Kanongata'a (9 total tackles), Jordan Tripp (7 TT), and Brock Coyle (7 TT). Senior safety Bo Tully had two key plays for the D – recovering a fumble and grabbing an interception, and he also had 6 tackles.

ASU's quarterback combination of senior Jamal Londry-Jackson and sophomore Kameron Bryant were 21-of-33-1 for 205 yards. The Mountaineers gained 123 rushing yards on 26 carries. Freshman linebacker John Law and sophomore linebacker Kevin Walton had a game-high 12 tackles each.

The Mountaineers had not lost a season opener to FCS opponent since losing 22-10 at North Carolina A&T in 1993.

GRAND FORKS, ND – Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson threw five touchdown passes – three of them to sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson, as the Grizzlies registered a convincing 55-17 non-league victory over the University of North Dakota Saturday evening in front of 9,726 mostly partisan fans in UND's Alerus Center.

Both teams are members of the Big Sky Conference, but this was a non-league contest, as the teams had a home-and-home agreement before UND joined the Big Sky. The teams meet again next season in Grand Forks for a conference game.

Johnson was incredibly efficient, going 15-of-19-0 for the five touchdowns, and he threw for a career-high 354 yards. Those numbers gave him passing efficiency rating of 322.3 – a Big Sky record. It was Johnson's first career 300-yard passing game in 14 starts. His five touchdown throws tied him with several other players for the second most ever in a game.

Henderson had five receptions for a career-best 124 yards, to go along with his three TD grabs. Those three touchdown catches tie him for the second most in a game with several other players.

Montana (2-0) was incredibly consistent on offense, scoring on its first five possessions, and converting nine-of-10 third downs.

The game was full of big plays by the visiting Grizzlies, as they scored on five touchdowns of 30 or more yards, and had three over 50 — including a 70-yarder, a 52-yarder, and a 51-yarder. Montana's offensive domination was evident by its first (and only) punt of the game, which occurred with 6:02 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' running attack was also solid, as halfback Jordan Canada rushed 14 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns, while fellow junior Travon Van had 10 totes for 72 yards and a score. It was Canada's second straight 100-yard rushing game and the fourth of his career.

Johnson hooked up with Van on a 70-yard touchdown pass, which ties for the 15th longest in school history.

UM's defense held UND's potent offense to 336 total yards (281 passing), while the Grizzlies had 609 total yards (376 passing and 233 rushing).

Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had three stops for loss and a pair of sacks, as well as 6 tackles. Griz senior linebacker Brock Coyle had a game-high nine tackles, while junior safety Matt Hermanson and senior linebacker Jordan Tripp each had seven stops. Tripp and sophomore cornerback Nate Harris each had an interception for UM.

UND (1-2) quarterback Joe Mollberg, a redshirt freshman, was 25-of-43-2 for 281 yards and two touchdowns, while sophomore wide receiver Jameer Jackson had 9 catches for 86 yards. All-American senior receiver Greg Hardin had 5 catches for 46 yards.

The win by Montana avenged a painful 40-34 loss by Montana at UND last season, in a game which UND had 704 total yards (and a conference record 660 yards passing), and scored nine points in the final two minutes of play.

The Griz had a big-play first half, with touchdown throws of 70, 53, 35, and 22 yards, with three of those TD passes by Johnson. The other TD throw was by wide receiver Chase Naccarato, which was the 22-yarder to Cam Warren. It was the first career pass attempt for Naccarato, a sophomore.

The teams play in Grand Forks for the third season in a row in a league game there in October of 2014.
