#10/11-Montana on the road to play UC Davis Aggies, Saturday, Oct. 12th

THE GAME: The 10th/11th-ranked (*FCS Coaches/Sports Network*) University of Montana Grizzlies (4-1/1-1 Big Sky Conference) continue league play, playing the UC Davis Aggies (2-4/2-0) Saturday, Oct. 12 in UCD's Aggie Stadium (10,849). Kickoff is at 5:07 p.m. (Mtn.).

GRIZ RADIO: Veteran **Mick Holien** is now in his 21st season as the "Voice of the Grizzlies." Former Griz (1991-94) wide receiver **Scott Gurnsey** provides in-booth color, while **Greg Sundberg** serves as the sideline reporter. UM's flagship station is KGVO Radio, 1290 AM/KVWE 101.5 FM. (*Grizzly Football Radio Network listed on add 1-1-1 of the weekly release*).

TV: The Montana-UC Davis game will be televised by Max Media of Montana. **Chris Byers** of KULR-TV in Billings calls the play-by-play, while former (1988-90) Grizzly quarterback **Grady Bennett** will provide in-booth color, and **Anna Cole** is the sideline reporter. It will be aired on KULR-TV in Billings; KFBB-TV in Great Falls; KHBB-TV in Helena; KTMF-TV in Missoula; KQYB-TV in Butte and Bozeman; and KXGN-TV in Glendive.

GRIZ LAST GAME (at Montana 55, Portland State 27): The 10th-ranked Grizzlies scored on five of their first six possessions, and the defense had a pair of impressive goal-line stands in the victory in UM's homecoming game. Montana also exhibited a power running game, rushing 47 times for 368 yards (and 17 first downs) – an average of 8.0 yards per attempt.

CENTURY CLUB: Halfbacks **Travon Van** and **Jordan Canada** each rushed for 100-plus yards. **Van** had a career-high 136, while **Canada** had 102. It was **Canada's** third 100-yard game this season and fifth in his career, while **Van** has two so far this season.

CANADA MOVES UP: **Canada** has now rushed for 1,511 career yards and 17 touchdowns to move up on UM's career lists. (*See add 2-2-2*).

TRIPP MOVES UP LIST: LB **Jordan Tripp** had a fumble recovery for a TD in the PSU win, gives him eight career recoveries -- tying him for the second most in UM history. (*See add 2*).

GRIZ POW NOMINEES: **Offense:** Senior tight end **Clay Pierson** had 3 catches for 71 yards, and 3 touchdowns (36, 25, 10). **Defense:** Cornerback **Anthony Goodwin:** 3 tackles, 2 ints., 7 PDs, and both picks led to Griz TDs. **Special Teams:** Sophomore linebacker **Kendrick Van Ackeren:** 4 tackles on the kickoff return coverage team.

GOODWIN HONORED: **Goodwin**, a senior from Murrieta, Calif., was named the Big Sky's "Player of the Week" on defense, and he was also named the national co-Defensive POW (along with defensive back *Cole Champion* of Yale), by the *Sports Network*. It is **Goodwin's** first player of the week award.

UC DAVIS SCORES TO DATE: at South Dakota 10 UC Davis 7; at Nevada 36, UC Davis 6; N. Arizona 21, at UC Davis 10; Portland State 41, at UC Davis 10; at UC Davis 30, Idaho State 13; UC Davis 21, at Southern Utah 3.

SERIES/LAST MEETING: Montana leads the series 4-0. Those scores: **1926:** at UM 21, UCD 0; **1995:** at UM 41, UCD 20; **2008:** at UM 29, UCD 24; and **2009:** UM 17 at UCD 10.

LAST TIME (Sept. 12, 2009): The Grizzlies had to overcome a 10-0 deficit third quarter deficit for the win. Montana scored back-to-back touchdowns on a pass from **Justin Roper** to **Sam Gratton**, and then what proved to be the game-winner, a 3-yard scoring run by **Chase Reynolds** which gave the Griz a 14-10 lead with 10:49 to go in the game.

The contest was delayed 16 minutes when the lights failed with 57 seconds to go and UC Davis facing a 4th-and-7 on UM's 12-yard line. Griz cornerback **Trumaine Johnson** out-jumped Aggie wide receiver **Chris Carter** in the end zone for a game-securing pick to thwart the last-second comeback bid. Aggie QB **Greg Denham** tied a school-record with 43 pass completions (in 67 attempts), while **Carter** set a UCD standard with 18 catches. Montana went 14-1 in 2009, losing 23-21 to Villanova in the FCS title game. UC Davis finished 6-5 in 2009.

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY**Second Year at Montana (9-7)**

Mick Delaney has a record of 9-7 in his second season as the head football coach at the University of Montana.

He is in his sixth season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM's associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

Delaney coached Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11. He was also instrumental in the development of running back Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10.

A veteran mentor, Delaney began his coaching career in 1964. The 2013 season is his 29th season of coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to Montana from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007. Former Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, and former mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck's staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation's most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 92. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

Delaney began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach. He also taught English at Central.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under former UM head coach Jack Swarthout from 1968-69. He was the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time as well.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-76) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He was an assistant coach on Lubick's staff at Montana State from 1979-80.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western (Western Montana College) in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the Western Montana College Sports Hall of Fame and was honored by the Montana Coaches Association in 1972 as the Wrestling Coach of the Year. In 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He also belonged to many associations during his athletic career including the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY:

ON UCD: "You know any game you play now in the Big Sky will be a challenge no matter who your opponent is. I think when you are on the road like we are this weekend, it's a lot more difficult. With it being their (the Aggies) homecoming game it will be very similar to what it was like at Northern Arizona (where it was "Family Weekend"). They (UC Davis) will try to put all of their eggs into one basket, sort-of-speak, to make sure they are prepared to try to play their best game of the season against the Griz, which always seems to be the case.

"We'll have to go down there and play like we did this past Saturday, and not like we did two Saturdays ago (at NAU). Whenever you play it's a simple formula -- don't turn the ball over, don't have a bunch of stupid penalties, and you will have a chance to win. If you do those first two things, then your chances to win are pretty slim."

ON THE PSU WIN: "I am just so proud of our players and coaches. We had a great game plan, and the kids just stayed so focused and executed that plan almost to perfection. Obviously we gave up some yards (511) on defense, but that's okay. Our goal going in to the game was to stop the run (PSU had 33 carries for 115 yards) and we did just that. And, because we were able to shut down their run, they had to become a little one-dimensional, and threw the ball almost every down in the second half, which made it a little easier for our defense."

ON THE GRIZ REPONDING TO A MUST-WIN GAME LAST WEEK: "We played well on all fronts. Our special teams were very, very good and the offense was unbelievable on Saturday as far as execution goes. We played physical football and did the things we had to do, like run the football very well, against a team (PSU) which some people hadn't been running the ball too well against. We played hard and we played smart."

BIG SKY NOTES (By Jon Kasper, BSC)

MCGHEE ENGINEERS 33rd WIN: Montana State QB DeNarius McGhee led MSU to a 36-7 win over Northern Arizona on Saturday, making his 33rd victory as a starting quarterback. McGhee is now tied with **Dave Dickenson** for second place in league history. **Dickenson led UM to 33 regular-season wins from 1993-95.** Nevada's Eric Beavers holds the Big Sky record with 40 career victories.

NAU DEFENSE SCORES AGAIN: NAU's Austin Hasquet returned an interception 37 yards for a touchdown in the Lumberjacks' 37-7 loss to MSU. It was NAU's sixth defensive touchdown this season, and fourth on an interception return. The league record for team interception returns for touchdowns is six by NAU in 1985. NAU has scored a defensive touchdown in four consecutive games. The six TDs have come by six different players. NAU's defense has scored as many touchdowns this season as its offense.

AGGIES 2-0 IN BIG SKY: After starting the season 0-4, UC Davis has won back-to-back conference games. UCD finished 3-5 last season in conference, the program's first in the Big Sky. Junior halfback *Gabe Manzanares* rushed for 175 yards on 33 carries with two touchdowns in the win over Southern Utah. *Manzanares* rushed for 208 yards and a touchdown the week prior in a win over Idaho State. The UC Davis defense, which is allowing 20.7 points per game, held SUU to 34 rushing yards and had five sacks.

A FIRST FOR THE HORNETS: Sacramento State beat Northern Colorado 37-21 on Saturday night at home to move to 2-0 in Big Sky play for the first time in school history. The Hornets joined the Big Sky in 1996.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: Montana is the only team remaining in the FCS that has yet to throw an interception this season. Every other Big Sky team has thrown at least three interceptions.

GRIZ PACKING THEM IN: Montana leads the nation with an average of **25,904 fans per home game.** MSU is fourth with an average of 19,960. James Madison of the CAA is second at 22,701, while Southern of the SWAC is third at 22,080.

EXTRA POINTS: MSU senior *Tanner Bleskin* became the school's all-time leader in receptions with 170. Sacramento State's *DeAndre Carter* leads the nation with 10 touchdown catches...Cal Poly's *Bobby Zalud* made a 53-yard field goal in a 24-10 loss to Yale -- the longest field goal in the FCS this season...Northern Colorado QB *Seth Lobato* returned last Saturday after missing two games with an injury. Lobato threw for 340 yards in a loss to Sacramento State...Home teams are 6-6 in the first 12 conference games.... NAU's *Zach Bauman* needs 76 rushing yards to move into seventh place on the Big Sky's all-time rushing list.

BIG SKY HIGHLIGHTS

Six conference games are on Saturday's Big Sky football schedule...Sacramento State, which is 2-0 in Big Sky play for the first time, plays host to No. 19 Northern Arizona. The Lumberjacks are looking to rebound following last week's loss to Montana State...**UC Davis, which is also off to a 2-0 start, will look to upset No. 11 Montana.**

No. 6 Eastern Washington treks to North Dakota. EWU is 1-0 in league. UND picked up its first conference win of the season last week and is playing a ranked opponent at home for the fourth time this season...Southern Utah plays host to Portland State. The Thunderbirds (4-2) are 1-1 at home this season. PSU is seeking its first conference victory.

Cal Poly, coming off a loss to Yale of the Ivy League, hosts Weber State. Cal Poly is 1-0 in league. WSU enters on a five-game losing streak...Idaho State plays host to Northern Colorado. Both teams are seeking their first conference wins. UNC is looking to end a five-game losing streak.

at MONTANA 30, APPALACHIAN STATE 6

MISSOULA, MONTANA (8/31/13) – Two of the premier teams in FCS football squared off, and the University of Montana Grizzlies came away with an impressive 30-6 victory over the Appalachian State Mountaineers in front of a record crowd of 26,293 in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium. It was the first ever regular-season night game in UM's stadium.

It was an impressive debut for the 20th-ranked Grizzlies, who racked up almost 500 yards of offense against a Mountaineers team (which had 328 total yards) that was 8-4 last season and returned 18 starters. ASU is making the move to the FBS next season, and because of that is not eligible for the FCS playoffs in 2013.

It was the first regular-season game under the lights for the Grizzlies, who jumped out to a 16-3 lead after an impressive first half in which they out-gained the 12th-ranked Mountaineers 272 total yards to 138, and had controlled the ball almost twice as much (19:05 to 10:55) time.

Montana took a 16-0 lead when junior quarterback Jordan Johnson connected with sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson on a 6-yard scoring pass, followed by junior running back Travon Van's 2-yard scoring run, and then a 25-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Chris Lider.

ASU finally got on the board when it marched 54 yards on five plays in the closing minutes of the second quarter, as senior place-kicker Drew Stewart nailed a 48-yard field goal as time expired at halftime.

Stewart cut the Griz advantage to 16-6 with a 21-yard field goal with 9:54 to go in the third quarter – which proved to be the only points scored by either squad in that stanza.

Montana, which is now 3-0 at home (and 3-1 overall) against ASU, tacked on two more touchdowns, the first on a 1-yard run by halfback Jordan Canada, and the second an 11-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper. Harper's TD, which were the final points scored in the game, came with 9:23 left to play.

Van's first game at Montana was a stellar one, as the transfer from Marshall rushed 20 times for 118 yards and a score, while Canada was just as outstanding, picking up 112 yards and a TD on 25 totes. Montana rushed 52 times for 246 yards and two scores.

Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson was a very competent 19-of-23-0 (82.6%) passing for 251 yards and two touchdowns.

Sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones, a transfer from Washington, had a team-high 6 catches for 60 yards, while Henderson had 3 grabs for 72 yards and a TD.

UM's defense, which held ASU to no touchdowns, was led by its three senior linebackers, J.P. Kanongata'a (9 total tackles), Jordan Tripp (7 TT), and Brock Coyle (7 TT). Senior safety Bo Tully had two key plays for the D – recovering a fumble and grabbing an interception, and he also had 6 tackles.

ASU's quarterback combination of senior Jamal Londry-Jackson and sophomore Kameron Bryant were 21-of-33-1 for 205 yards. The Mountaineers gained 123 rushing yards on 26 carries. Freshman linebacker John Law and sophomore linebacker Kevin Walton had a game-high 12 tackles each.

The Mountaineers had not lost a season opener to FCS opponent since losing 22-10 at North Carolina A&T in 1993.

MONTANA 55, at NORTH DAKOTA 17

GRAND FORKS, ND – Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson threw five touchdown passes – three of them to sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson, as the Grizzlies registered a convincing 55-17 non-league victory over the University of North Dakota Saturday evening in front of 9,726 mostly partisan fans in UND's Alerus Center.

Both teams are members of the Big Sky Conference, but this was a non-league contest, as the teams had a home-and-home agreement before UND joined the Big Sky. The teams meet again next season in Grand Forks for a conference game.

Johnson was incredibly efficient, going 15-of-19-0 for the five touchdowns, and he threw for a career-high 354 yards. Those numbers gave him passing efficiency rating of 322.3 – a Big Sky record. It was Johnson's first career 300-yard passing game in 14 starts. His five touchdown throws tied him with several other players for the second most ever in a game.

Henderson had five receptions for a career-best 124 yards, to go along with his three TD grabs. Those three touchdown catches tie him for the second most in a game with several other players.

Montana (2-0) was incredibly consistent on offense, scoring on its first five possessions, and converting nine-of-10 third downs.

The game was full of big plays by the visiting Grizzlies, as they scored on five touchdowns of 30 or more yards, and had three over 50 — including a 70-yarder, a 52-yarder, and a 51-yarder. Montana's offensive domination was evident by its first (and only) punt of the game, which occurred with 6:02 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' running attack was also solid, as halfback Jordan Canada rushed 14 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns, while fellow junior Travon Van had 10 totes for 72 yards and a score. It was Canada's second straight 100-yard rushing game and the fourth of his career.

Johnson hooked up with Van on a 70-yard touchdown pass, which ties for the 15th longest in school history.

UM's defense held UND's potent offense to 336 total yards (281 passing), while the Grizzlies had 609 total yards (376 passing and 233 rushing).

Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had three stops for loss and a pair of sacks, as well as 6 tackles. Griz senior linebacker Brock Coyle had a game-high nine tackles, while junior safety Matt Hermanson and senior linebacker Jordan Tripp each had seven stops. Tripp and sophomore cornerback Nate Harris each had an interception for UM.

UND (1-2) quarterback Joe Mollberg, a redshirt freshman, was 25-of-43-2 for 281 yards and two touchdowns, while sophomore wide receiver Jameer Jackson had 9 catches for 86 yards. All-American senior receiver Greg Hardin had 5 catches for 46 yards.

The win by Montana avenged a painful 40-34 loss by Montana at UND last season, in a game which UND had 704 total yards (and a conference record 660 yards passing), and scored nine points in the final two minutes of play.

The Griz had a big-play first half, with touchdown throws of 70, 53, 35, and 22 yards, with three of those TD passes by Johnson. The other TD throw was by wide receiver Chase Naccarato, which was the 22-yarder to Cam Warren. It was the first career pass attempt for Naccarato, a sophomore.

The teams play in Grand Forks for the third season in a row in a league game there in October of 2014.

MISSOULA, MONTANA -- The 9th/11th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies scored on six of their first seven possessions and true freshman halfback John Nguyen rushed for 144 yards, as UM cruised to a 47-14 victory over the out-manned Oklahoma Panhandle State Aggies in a non-league game Saturday afternoon.

A boisterous (first half anyway) Washington-Grizzly Stadium crowd of 25,814 was on hand – the eighth largest in WGS history (196 games).

A lot of the starters for the Grizzlies played in just a handful of series in the contest, and the outcome was pretty much decided in the first quarter.

The game started with a two-play, 71-yard drive, with quarterback Jordan Johnson connecting with wide receiver Ellis Henderson for a 17-yard touchdown, as UM went up 7-0 in the first 41 seconds of action. Henderson's score was set up by a 54-yard run on an end-around play by wide-out Chase Naccarato.

The Aggies (1-3) held the Griz on their next series, but Montana then scored on its next five possessions, and when quarterback Shay Smithwick-Hann threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Taylor Walcott, who made a difficult, one-handed grab, UM took a commanding 31-0 lead with 1:43 to go in the first quarter.

Montana head coach Mick Delaney brought in his back-ups early, and all 63 players who suited up and were able to play saw action. The Griz tacked on another TD early in the second quarter on a 5-yard run by halfback Joey Counts to take a 38-0 lead with 14:02 left until halftime.

OPSU scored two unanswered touchdowns against UM's number two defense, making the score 38-14 at intermission. The Aggies' scores came on a 5-yard scoring throw from quarterback Caleb Holbrook to Tim Hollingshed, and a 1-yard run by 6-1, 258-pound sophomore tight end Kameron Young.

The Grizzlies shut out the Aggies, a Division II independent with an enrollment of 1,400, in the second half. OPSU was limited to 91 total yards and four first downs in the final 30 minutes of play.

Montana's nine second half total points all came in the third quarter, and all came via field goals, as Ben Worst nailed a pair of 41-yarders, and redshirt frosh Harrison Greenberg made a 21-yarder.

One of the highlights of the game was provided by Worst, a true freshman from Twin Falls, Idaho, who connected on a 50-yard field goal in the opening quarter. Worst, whose 50-yarder tied him for the sixth longest field goal in school history, made all three of his field goal attempts.

Johnson played in just four series and all were in the first quarter, was 3-of-6 passing for 59 yards and a touchdown. Smithwick-Hann was 3-of-9-0 for 29 yards and two TDs, while redshirt freshman QB Brady Gustafson went 2-of-4-0 for 40 yards.

UM had eight different players catch passes, and Henderson, Walcott, and true freshman tight end Jordan Harper had one scoring reception each. Nguyen had 22 carries for his 144 yards.

Counts and junior halfback Travon Van each rushed for a touchdown. UM's top two rushers, Jordan Canada and Travon Van combined for just eight carries and 17 yards. Montana rushed 45 times for 262 yards and two scores.

The three Griz quarterbacks' passing totals were 8-of-19-0 for 128 yards and three touchdowns. Sophomore QB Trent McKinney did not play due to an illness.

Sophomore linebacker Addison Owen had five tackles, an interception, and a fumble recovery. Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had 2.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble in limited action.

Holbrook was 8-of-18-1 passing for 50 yards and the one TD pass. Sophomore running back Chris McClendon led OPSU with 57 yards rushing on 14 totes. Aggie linebacker Tanner Hallford had a game-high 9 tackles.

FLAGSTAFF, ARIZONA—Northern Arizona University's Zach Bauman rushed for 118 yards and 2 touchdowns and the Lumberjacks returned two fumbles for scores, as they defeated the Montana Grizzlies in NAU's Walkup Skydome.

It was the Big Sky Conference opener for the teams, as the Grizzlies (3-1/0-1) suffered their first defeat of the season, and the Jacks (3-1/1-0) registered their third victory in a row.

It was the second straight win for NAU over Montana. The Grizzlies had defeated the Lumberjacks 14 consecutive seasons until losing this season and last year. It was NAU's first win over UM in Flagstaff since 1997 (27-24).

The Griz put themselves in a deep hole early in the third quarter, as cornerback Marcus Allen recovered a UM fumble and returned it 22 yards for a touchdown, giving NAU a 25-point, 28-3 lead with 13:59 left in that stanza.

Montana's offense struggled in the first three quarters, and scored its first touchdown of the game with 12:14 left, when Jordan Johnson tossed a 15-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Mitch Saylor.

After the Johnson-to-Saylor hook-up NAU kicker Andy Wilder connected on back-to-back field goals from 23 and 46 yards out, and his second three-pointer gave the Jacks a 34-10 advantage with 5:01 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' final score came on a 9-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper with 3:02 to go.

The Jacks took a commanding early first-quarter lead, as Bauman scored on back-to-back touchdowns on runs of 41 and 5 yards, his second TD run coming with 8:26 remaining in the opening stanza.

UM's only points in the first half came on a 42-yard field goal by freshman kicker Ben Worst with 5:20 left in the first quarter.

NAU tacked on another score on a 95-yard fumble return by linebacker Ryan Reardon with 2:03 left until halftime. That defensive score came after Griz quarterback Jordan Johnson tried to score on a 4th-and-3, but the ball was jarred loose and Reardon scooped in up and raced into the end zone for the score.

NAU led 21-3 at intermission. Bauman had 11 carries for 92 yards and his two scores in the first half.

Johnson was 17-of-38-0 for 292 yards and 2 TDs, but was sacked four times. Halfback Travon Van led UM with 45 yards rushing on eight carries.

The Griz defense was led by senior linebacker Brock Coyle with a game-high 13 tackles, while fellow senior linebacker Jordan Tripp had 8 tackles, including two for losses.

At Montana 55, Portland State 27

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The 10th-ranked Montana Grizzlies scored on five of their first six possessions, and the defense had a pair of impressive goal-line stands in a 55-27 Big Sky Conference victory over the Portland State Vikings in UM's homecoming game.

It was UM's eighth win in a row over PSU, and the Vikings have now lost 10 straight in Missoula.

In the victory, Montana also exhibited a power running game, rushing 47 times for 368 yards (and 17 first downs) – an average of 8.0 yards per attempt. UM had the ball for 34 minutes.

The Griz went three-and-out their first time on offense, but then ripped out five straight scores, and on the fifth – a 2-yard touchdown run by halfback Jordan Canada, they took a 35-13 lead with 8:16 left until halftime.

Senior tight end Clay Pierson started UM's scoring onslaught with a 36-yard scoring pass from quarterback Jordan Johnson with 12:22 to go in the opening quarter. It was Pierson's first catch of the season, and ended up with two more TD receptions in the contest.

After UM's initial score, PSU answered with one of its own, as quarterback Kieran McDonagh connected with running back Shaq Richard on a 32-yard touchdown pass. An errant center snap from center foiled the Vikings' PAT attempt, and the Griz had a slim 7-6 lead at 10:45 in the first stanza.

Montana took a 14-6 lead on its next possession as halfback Travon Van broke loose for a 42-yard TD run with 8:06 remaining in the first quarter. PSU fumbled on its own 2-yard line on its next series, and UM linebacker Jordan Tripp recovered the ball in the end zone for a TD, and UM took a 21-6 lead with 7:18 to go in the first.

PSU cut the UM lead to 21-13 on a touchdown pass, but the Griz responded with back-to-back touchdowns, on a pass from Johnson to wide-out Cam Warren, and Canada's 2-yarder, and UM took a 22-point (35-13) lead. The Vikings scored with 1:31 left until halftime, as the Griz led 35-20 at intermission.

UM's first big goal-line stand came mid-way through the second quarter, when PSU had first-and-goal at the Grizzlies' 5-yard line. Senior cornerback Anthony Goodwin had two pass deflections, and Tripp stopped PSU running back DJ Adams for a 2-yard loss, as the Griz held the Vikings out of the endzone.

Montana scored on its first four possessions of the second half, and jumped to an insurmountable 55-20 advantage with 9:02 left to play. The Grizzlies' scoring plays in the last two quarters were a pair of touchdown passes (25, 10) from Johnson to Pierson, and two field goals by kicker Ben Worst.

UM's other goal-line stop occurred in the middle of the third quarter, when the Vikings had a first-and-goal on UM's 3-yard line. On first down McDonagh rushed to the 1-yard line, but after short gain that he had an incomplete pass, Adams was stopped (by Zack Wagenmann) for a 1-yard loss, and then McDonagh was stopped at the 1-yard line on a tackle by Alex Bienemann and Wagenmann, and PSU was once again denied any points.

Van and Canada both had 100-plus yard rushing games. Van gained a career-high 136 yards and Canada gained 102.

Johnson was 12-of-24-0 for 203 yards and 4 touchdowns. Pierson had 3 catches – all three went for TDs.

Tripp had a game-high 10 tackles, a TFL, and the fumble recovery for the TD. Linebacker Brock Coyle and end Derek Crittenden had 9 tackles apiece. Goodwin had 2 interceptions and will remain among the FCS leaders in pass break-ups, as he had 7 PDs to go along with 3 tackles.

Adams rushed 18 times for 79 yards. McDonagh was 18-of-32-2 for 266 yards and two scores, and held to 13 yards rushing on just six attempts. PSU receiver Victor Dean, a 6-6 junior, had 4 grabs for 118 yards and 2 TDs.
