#9/#10-Montana hosts Cal Poly in another pivotal Big Sky game Oct. 19th

THE GAME: The 9th/10th/-ranked (*FCS Coaches/Sports Network polls*) University of Montana Grizzlies (5-1/2-1 Big Sky Conference) continue league play, hosting the first-place (tie) Cal Poly Mustangs (3-3/2-0) Saturday, Oct. 12 in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium (25,217). Kickoff is at 1:37 p.m. (Mountain Time).

GRIZ RADIO: Veteran **Mick Holien** is now in his 21st season as the "Voice of the Grizzlies." Former Griz (1991-94) wide receiver **Scott Gurnsey** provides in-booth color, while **Greg Sundberg** serves as the sideline reporter. UM's flagship station is KGVO Radio, 1290 AM/KVWE 101.5 FM. (*Grizzly Football Radio Network listed on add 1-1-1 of the weekly release*).

TV: The Montana-Cal Poly game will be televised by **Max Media of Montana's on its ABC affiliates**. **Chris Byers** of KULR-TV in Billings calls the play-by-play, while former (1988-90) Grizzly quarterback **Grady Bennett** will provide in-booth color, and **Shaun Rainey** is the sideline reporter.

GRIZ LAST GAME (Montana 42, at UC Davis 7) : Halfback **Jordan Canada** rushed for two TDs and wide receiver **Ellis Henderson** had two scoring receptions, and the defense was stellar, as the Grizzlies defeated UC Davis in a homecoming contest in Aggie Stadium.

Canada rushed 24 times for 126 yards. **Canada** has now rushed for 100 or more yards in four of six games this season, and six times in his career. **Henderson** had 3 catches for 63 yards and two touchdowns. Griz junior quarterback **Jordan Johnson** was 12-of-20-0 for 163 yards and 2 TDs.

The Grizzlies racked up 418 total yards, rushed 51 times for 255 yards and 3 TDs, and picked up 25 first downs. Montana executed flawlessly, as they had zero penalties.

Montana's "D" held UC Davis to 237 net yards and 14 first downs, and registered four sacks. The Griz defense also intercepted two passes. **Brock Coyle** led UM with 7 tackles and also had a pick, while fellow senior linebacker **Jordan Tripp** added 5 stops, as did sophomore LB **Kendrick Van Ackeren**. Safety **Bo Tully** had UM's other interception.

CANADA MOVES UP CAREER LISTS: **Canada** is now ranked seventh in career touchdowns (19) and 13th in career rush yards (1,637). (*See add 2-2-2*).

TRIPP MOVES UP LIST: Linebacker **Jordan Tripp** is now ranked 14th in career tackles with 273. All three senior linebackers: **Tripp**, **Brock Coyle** (28th, 217), and **J.P. Kanongata'a** (31st, 210) are ranked on the Grizzlies' all-time tackles list. (*See add 3-3-3*).

GRIZ POW NOMINEES: **Canada**, a junior from Duarte, Calif., was UM's nominee for Big Sky "Player of the Week" honors on offense. **Coyle**, a senior from Bozeman, was the defensive nominee. The Griz did not have a special teams nominee.

CAL POLY SCORES TO DATE: at Cal Poly 38, San Diego 16; at Fresno State 41, Cal Poly 25; at Colorado State 34, Cal Poly 17; at Cal Poly 38, Portland State 34; Yale 24, at Cal Poly 10; at Cal Poly 47, Weber State 0.

SERIES/LAST MEETING: The Griz lead the series 14-2. The Mustangs beat the Grizzlies 35-21 in Missoula the first and only time in 2005 in a first-round FCS playoff game. Montana, which finished 8-4 in 2005, had defeated Cal Poly 36-27 at home in a regular-season contest which had been played about a month earlier that season. The Mustangs went 9-4 in 2005.

LAST TIME THEY PLAYED (Sept. 10, 2011): The Grizzlies out-scored the Mustangs 23-6 in the second half en route to a 37-23 homecoming win that featured seven lead changes and a tie. Cal Poly rushed 64 times for 265 yards and two TDs. **Johnson** passed for 240 yards and 2 touchdowns, and he also led the Griz with 54 yards rushing.

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY**Second Year at Montana (10-7)**

Mick Delaney has a record of 10-7 in his second season as the head football coach at the University of Montana.

He is in his sixth season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM's associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

Delaney coached Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11. He was also instrumental in the development of running back Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10.

A veteran mentor, Delaney began his coaching career in 1964. The 2013 season is his 29th season of coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to Montana from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007. Former Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, and former mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck's staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation's most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 92. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

Delaney began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach. He also taught English at Central.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under former UM head coach Jack Swarthout from 1968-69. He was the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time as well.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-76) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He was an assistant coach on Lubick's staff at Montana State from 1979-80.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western (Western Montana College) in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the Western Montana College Sports Hall of Fame and was honored by the Montana Coaches Association in 1972 as the Wrestling Coach of the Year. In 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He also belonged to many associations during his athletic career including the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY:

ON CALPOLY: "It's hard to prepare for an offense like Cal Poly runs in a week, as it has been since the beginning of the wishbone and now the option. It's a lot of the same, except there's more mis-direction now in the option offense. That's got to be the primary focus on the defense obviously -- to stop the run. Being ranked third in the country in rushing says a lot about that phase of their offense. It's assignment football when you face the triple option, and guys can't guess and they need to be where they are supposed to be and make plays in space.

"They'll be good at quarterback no matter who they have in there. They're very athletic at quarterback and running back, as they always have been, plus they have a good fullback (6-2, 215-pound senior Akaninyene Umoh).

"They are a very good defensive team. I think the strength of their defense is probably right down the middle, especially their two inside tackles and number 94 (6-4, 280-pound senior Sullivan Grosz), who is a real force. Their two inside backers are also very good players, and I think their safety, (5-9, 185-pound senior) Alex Hubbard is a hitter and a great tackler. They swarm to the ball on defense."

ON THE UC DAVIS GAME: "To go on the road and play as well as we did was a real positive for us. I am just so proud of our coaches and our players. We executed the game plan almost perfectly in every phase of the game. I don't know if I've ever seen our defense have that many straight (seven) three-and-outs in a row as we had in that first half. We knew we had to stop the run and force them into throwing, and we did that. I am not a big stats guy, but when you hold a team like that under 300 yards (UCD had 237) of total offense, that's a great defensive effort. We rushed for more than 250 and we were very, very efficient in throwing the ball. You put those two things together, plus no penalties, plus no turnovers -- that usually adds up to winning the game."

AT MONTANA 37, CAL POLY 23

MISSOULA, MONTANA — The Grizzlies dominated the second half and went on to register a hard-fought 37-23 victory over the Mustangs.

There were 25,855 fans on hand for UM's 2011 home opener — the third largest crowd ever in Washington-Grizzly Stadium in the 185 games played there since 1986.

The Grizzlies (1-1) out-scored the Mustangs (0-2) 23-6 in the second half, holding them to just two field goals. Montana out-gained Cal Poly substantially in the final 30 minutes, as the Griz picked up 273 total yards and the Mustangs had 121.

There were seven lead changes and just one tie in the contest. Montana finally took the lead for good when sophomore quarterback Jordan Johnson threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Kavario Middleton, giving UM a 29-23 advantage with 58 seconds to go in the third quarter. After his TD pass Johnson rushed for the two-point conversion.

Montana got an insurance touchdown with 8:30 remaining on a 1-yard run by junior running back Dan Moore. The Griz then scored another two-point conversion, this time on Johnson-to-Middleton pass.

Jabin Sambrano got the crowd on its feet early, as he broke away on the opening kickoff for a 96-yard touchdown. It was the fifth longest kickoff return in school history.

Cal Poly of the Great West Football Conference came right back though, as senior fullback Jake Romanelli scored on a 4-yard run, making it 7-7 with 9:02 to go in the first quarter. Sophomore kicker James Langford's 38-yard field goal gave the Mustangs a 10-7 edge with 2:54 left in the opening stanza.

Moore got the lead back for the Griz on his first touchdown run, this one from four yards out, giving his team a 14-10 lead with 9:51 to go until intermission. Cal Poly took a 17-14 lead on a 1-yard run by junior quarterback Andre Broadous with five seconds left until halftime.

Cal Poly took its largest led (20-14) of the game at the 10:19 mark of the third stanza on a 36-yard field goal by Langford. The Griz went ahead again in less than two minutes, as Sambrano scored again, this time on a 58-yard pass from Johnson. Senior kicker Brody McKnight's PAT gave the Griz a 21-20 lead.

The Mustangs took their fourth and final lead (23-21) with 4:21 left in the third quarter on a 50-yard field goal by Langford.

Johnson was 25-of-39-0 for 240 yards and two touchdowns. He was 19-of-27 for 205 yards and threw both of his TD passes in the second half. Johnson also led the Griz in rushing with 54 yards on 10 carries, while Moore had 13 totes for 30 yards and two scores. The Griz O-line did not give up a sack for the second game in a row.

Sambrano had 5 catches for 70 yards, while junior tight end Greg Hardy had 4 catches, and senior receiver C.J. Atkins, junior halfback Peter Nguyen, and Moore had three receptions each. Sambrano had 244 all-purpose yards, 174 on returns and 70 receiving.

Griz senior linebacker Caleb McSurdy tied his career-high with a game-high 17 tackles. Senior linebacker Alex Shaw had 11 tackles, while senior safety Mike McCord and senior tackle Bryan Waldhauser had 10 stops apiece.

Cal Poly's option offense rolled to 265 yards rushing on 64 carries, but they had just 67 yards passing. Romanelli gained 98 yards on 20 carries, while Broadous had 90 on 22 rushes. He had 356 total yards (240 passing and 116 rushing).

MISSOULA, MONTANA (8/31/13) – Two of the premier teams in FCS football squared off, and the University of Montana Grizzlies came away with an impressive 30-6 victory over the Appalachian State Mountaineers in front of a record crowd of 26,293 in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium. It was the first ever regular-season night game in UM's stadium.

It was an impressive debut for the 20th-ranked Grizzlies, who racked up almost 500 yards of offense against a Mountaineers team (which had 328 total yards) that was 8-4 last season and returned 18 starters. ASU is making the move to the FBS next season, and because of that is not eligible for the FCS playoffs in 2013.

It was the first regular-season game under the lights for the Grizzlies, who jumped out to a 16-3 lead after an impressive first half in which they out-gained the 12th-ranked Mountaineers 272 total yards to 138, and had controlled the ball almost twice as much (19:05 to 10:55) time.

Montana took a 16-0 lead when junior quarterback Jordan Johnson connected with sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson on a 6-yard scoring pass, followed by junior running back Travon Van's 2-yard scoring run, and then a 25-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Chris Lider.

ASU finally got on the board when it marched 54 yards on five plays in the closing minutes of the second quarter, as senior place-kicker Drew Stewart nailed a 48-yard field goal as time expired at halftime.

Stewart cut the Griz advantage to 16-6 with a 21-yard field goal with 9:54 to go in the third quarter – which proved to be the only points scored by either squad in that stanza.

Montana, which is now 3-0 at home (and 3-1 overall) against ASU, tacked on two more touchdowns, the first on a 1-yard run by halfback Jordan Canada, and the second an 11-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper. Harper's TD, which were the final points scored in the game, came with 9:23 left to play.

Van's first game at Montana was a stellar one, as the transfer from Marshall rushed 20 times for 118 yards and a score, while Canada was just as outstanding, picking up 112 yards and a TD on 25 totes. Montana rushed 52 times for 246 yards and two scores.

Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson was a very competent 19-of-23-0 (82.6%) passing for 251 yards and two touchdowns.

Sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones, a transfer from Washington, had a team-high 6 catches for 60 yards, while Henderson had 3 grabs for 72 yards and a TD.

UM's defense, which held ASU to no touchdowns, was led by its three senior linebackers, J.P. Kanongata'a (9 total tackles), Jordan Tripp (7 TT), and Brock Coyle (7 TT). Senior safety Bo Tully had two key plays for the D – recovering a fumble and grabbing an interception, and he also had 6 tackles.

ASU's quarterback combination of senior Jamal Londry-Jackson and sophomore Kameron Bryant were 21-of-33-1 for 205 yards. The Mountaineers gained 123 rushing yards on 26 carries. Freshman linebacker John Law and sophomore linebacker Kevin Walton had a game-high 12 tackles each.

The Mountaineers had not lost a season opener to FCS opponent since losing 22-10 at North Carolina A&T in 1993.

GRAND FORKS, ND – Junior quarterback Jordan Johnson threw five touchdown passes – three of them to sophomore wide receiver Ellis Henderson, as the Grizzlies registered a convincing 55-17 non-league victory over the University of North Dakota Saturday evening in front of 9,726 mostly partisan fans in UND's Alerus Center.

Both teams are members of the Big Sky Conference, but this was a non-league contest, as the teams had a home-and-home agreement before UND joined the Big Sky. The teams meet again next season in Grand Forks for a conference game.

Johnson was incredibly efficient, going 15-of-19-0 for the five touchdowns, and he threw for a career-high 354 yards. Those numbers gave him passing efficiency rating of 322.3 – a Big Sky record. It was Johnson's first career 300-yard passing game in 14 starts. His five touchdown throws tied him with several other players for the second most ever in a game.

Henderson had five receptions for a career-best 124 yards, to go along with his three TD grabs. Those three touchdown catches tie him for the second most in a game with several other players.

Montana (2-0) was incredibly consistent on offense, scoring on its first five possessions, and converting nine-of-10 third downs.

The game was full of big plays by the visiting Grizzlies, as they scored on five touchdowns of 30 or more yards, and had three over 50 — including a 70-yarder, a 52-yarder, and a 51-yarder. Montana's offensive domination was evident by its first (and only) punt of the game, which occurred with 6:02 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' running attack was also solid, as halfback Jordan Canada rushed 14 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns, while fellow junior Travon Van had 10 totes for 72 yards and a score. It was Canada's second straight 100-yard rushing game and the fourth of his career.

Johnson hooked up with Van on a 70-yard touchdown pass, which ties for the 15th longest in school history.

UM's defense held UND's potent offense to 336 total yards (281 passing), while the Grizzlies had 609 total yards (376 passing and 233 rushing).

Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had three stops for loss and a pair of sacks, as well as 6 tackles. Griz senior linebacker Brock Coyle had a game-high nine tackles, while junior safety Matt Hermanson and senior linebacker Jordan Tripp each had seven stops. Tripp and sophomore cornerback Nate Harris each had an interception for UM.

UND (1-2) quarterback Joe Mollberg, a redshirt freshman, was 25-of-43-2 for 281 yards and two touchdowns, while sophomore wide receiver Jameer Jackson had 9 catches for 86 yards. All-American senior receiver Greg Hardin had 5 catches for 46 yards.

The win by Montana avenged a painful 40-34 loss by Montana at UND last season, in a game which UND had 704 total yards (and a conference record 660 yards passing), and scored nine points in the final two minutes of play.

The Griz had a big-play first half, with touchdown throws of 70, 53, 35, and 22 yards, with three of those TD passes by Johnson. The other TD throw was by wide receiver Chase Naccarato, which was the 22-yarder to Cam Warren. It was the first career pass attempt for Naccarato, a sophomore.

The teams play in Grand Forks for the third season in a row in a league game there in October of 2014.

MISSOULA, MONTANA -- The 9th/11th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies scored on six of their first seven possessions and true freshman halfback John Nguyen rushed for 144 yards, as UM cruised to a 47-14 victory over the out-manned Oklahoma Panhandle State Aggies in a non-league game Saturday afternoon.

A boisterous (first half anyway) Washington-Grizzly Stadium crowd of 25,814 was on hand – the eighth largest in WGS history (196 games).

A lot of the starters for the Grizzlies played in just a handful of series in the contest, and the outcome was pretty much decided in the first quarter.

The game started with a two-play, 71-yard drive, with quarterback Jordan Johnson connecting with wide receiver Ellis Henderson for a 17-yard touchdown, as UM went up 7-0 in the first 41 seconds of action. Henderson's score was set up by a 54-yard run on an end-around play by wide-out Chase Naccarato.

The Aggies (1-3) held the Griz on their next series, but Montana then scored on its next five possessions, and when quarterback Shay Smithwick-Hann threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Taylor Walcott, who made a difficult, one-handed grab, UM took a commanding 31-0 lead with 1:43 to go in the first quarter.

Montana head coach Mick Delaney brought in his back-ups early, and all 63 players who suited up and were able to play saw action. The Griz tacked on another TD early in the second quarter on a 5-yard run by halfback Joey Counts to take a 38-0 lead with 14:02 left until halftime.

OPSU scored two unanswered touchdowns against UM's number two defense, making the score 38-14 at intermission. The Aggies' scores came on a 5-yard scoring throw from quarterback Caleb Holbrook to Tim Hollingshed, and a 1-yard run by 6-1, 258-pound sophomore tight end Kameron Young.

The Grizzlies shut out the Aggies, a Division II independent with an enrollment of 1,400, in the second half. OPSU was limited to 91 total yards and four first downs in the final 30 minutes of play.

Montana's nine second half total points all came in the third quarter, and all came via field goals, as Ben Worst nailed a pair of 41-yarders, and redshirt frosh Harrison Greenberg made a 21-yarder.

One of the highlights of the game was provided by Worst, a true freshman from Twin Falls, Idaho, who connected on a 50-yard field goal in the opening quarter. Worst, whose 50-yarder tied him for the sixth longest field goal in school history, made all three of his field goal attempts.

Johnson played in just four series and all were in the first quarter, was 3-of-6 passing for 59 yards and a touchdown. Smithwick-Hann was 3-of-9-0 for 29 yards and two TDs, while redshirt freshman QB Brady Gustafson went 2-of-4-0 for 40 yards.

UM had eight different players catch passes, and Henderson, Walcott, and true freshman tight end Jordan Harper had one scoring reception each. Nguyen had 22 carries for his 144 yards.

Counts and junior halfback Travon Van each rushed for a touchdown. UM's top two rushers, Jordan Canada and Travon Van combined for just eight carries and 17 yards. Montana rushed 45 times for 262 yards and two scores.

The three Griz quarterbacks' passing totals were 8-of-19-0 for 128 yards and three touchdowns. Sophomore QB Trent McKinney did not play due to an illness.

Sophomore linebacker Addison Owen had five tackles, an interception, and a fumble recovery. Junior defensive end Zack Wagenmann had 2.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble in limited action.

Holbrook was 8-of-18-1 passing for 50 yards and the one TD pass. Sophomore running back Chris McClendon led OPSU with 57 yards rushing on 14 totes. Aggie linebacker Tanner Hallford had a game-high 9 tackles.

At Northern Arizona 34, Montana 16

FLAGSTAFF, ARIZONA – Northern Arizona University's Zach Bauman rushed for 118 yards and 2 touchdowns and the Lumberjacks returned two fumbles for scores, as they defeated the Montana Grizzlies in NAU's Walkup Skydome.

It was the Big Sky Conference opener for the teams, as the Grizzlies (3-1/0-1) suffered their first defeat of the season, and the Jacks (3-1/1-0) registered their third victory in a row.

It was the second straight win for NAU over Montana. The Grizzlies had defeated the Lumberjacks 14 consecutive seasons until losing this season and last year. It was NAU's first win over UM in Flagstaff since 1997 (27-24).

The Griz put themselves in a deep hole early in the third quarter, as cornerback Marcus Allen recovered a UM fumble and returned it 22 yards for a touchdown, giving NAU a 25-point, 28-3 lead with 13:59 left in that stanza.

Montana's offense struggled in the first three quarters, and scored its first touchdown of the game with 12:14 left, when Jordan Johnson tossed a 15-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Mitch Saylor.

After the Johnson-to-Saylor hook-up NAU kicker Andy Wilder connected on back-to-back field goals from 23 and 46 yards out, and his second three-pointer gave the Jacks a 34-10 advantage with 5:01 left in the contest.

The Grizzlies' final score came on a 9-yard pass from Johnson to freshman tight end Jordan Harper with 3:02 to go.

The Jacks took a commanding early first-quarter lead, as Bauman scored on back-to-back touchdowns on runs of 41 and 5 yards, his second TD run coming with 8:26 remaining in the opening stanza.

UM's only points in the first half came on a 42-yard field goal by freshman kicker Ben Worst with 5:20 left in the first quarter.

NAU tacked on another score on a 95-yard fumble return by linebacker Ryan Reardon with 2:03 left until halftime. That defensive score came after Griz quarterback Jordan Johnson tried to score on a 4th-and-3, but the ball was jarred loose and Reardon scooped in up and raced into the end zone for the score.

NAU led 21-3 at intermission. Bauman had 11 carries for 92 yards and his two scores in the first half.

Johnson was 17-of-38-0 for 292 yards and 2 TDs, but was sacked four times. Halfback Travon Van led UM with 45 yards rushing on eight carries.

The Griz defense was led by senior linebacker Brock Coyle with a game-high 13 tackles, while fellow senior linebacker Jordan Tripp had 8 tackles, including two for losses.

At Montana 55, Portland State 27

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The 10th-ranked Montana Grizzlies scored on five of their first six possessions, and the defense had a pair of impressive goal-line stands in a 55-27 Big Sky Conference victory over the Portland State Vikings in UM's homecoming game.

It was UM's eighth win in a row over PSU, and the Vikings have now lost 10 straight in Missoula.

In the victory, Montana also exhibited a power running game, rushing 47 times for 368 yards (and 17 first downs) – an average of 8.0 yards per attempt. UM had the ball for 34 minutes.

The Griz went three-and-out their first time on offense, but then ripped out five straight scores, and on the fifth – a 2-yard touchdown run by halfback Jordan Canada, they took a 35-13 lead with 8:16 left until halftime.

Senior tight end Clay Pierson started UM's scoring onslaught with a 36-yard scoring pass from quarterback Jordan Johnson with 12:22 to go in the opening quarter. It was Pierson's first catch of the season, and ended up with two more TD receptions in the contest.

After UM's initial score, PSU answered with one of its own, as quarterback Kieran McDonagh connected with running back Shaq Richard on a 32-yard touchdown pass. An errant center snap from center foiled the Vikings' PAT attempt, and the Griz had a slim 7-6 lead at 10:45 in the first stanza.

Montana took a 14-6 lead on its next possession as halfback Travon Van broke loose for a 42-yard TD run with 8:06 remaining in the first quarter. PSU fumbled on its own 2-yard line on its next series, and UM linebacker Jordan Tripp recovered the ball in the end zone for a TD, and UM took a 21-6 lead with 7:18 to go in the first.

PSU cut the UM lead to 21-13 on a touchdown pass, but the Griz responded with back-to-back touchdowns, on a pass from Johnson to wide-out Cam Warren, and Canada's 2-yarder, and UM took a 22-point (35-13) lead. The Vikings scored with 1:31 left until halftime, as the Griz led 35-20 at intermission.

UM's first big goal-line stand came mid-way through the second quarter, when PSU had first-and-goal at the Grizzlies' 5-yard line. Senior cornerback Anthony Goodwin had two pass deflections, and Tripp stopped PSU running back DJ Adams for a 2-yard loss, as the Griz held the Vikings out of the endzone.

Montana scored on its first four possessions of the second half, and jumped to an insurmountable 55-20 advantage with 9:02 left to play. The Grizzlies' scoring plays in the last two quarters were a pair of touchdown passes (25, 10) from Johnson to Pierson, and two field goals by kicker Ben Worst.

UM's other goal-line stop occurred in the middle of the third quarter, when the Vikings had a first-and-goal on UM's 3-yard line. On first down McDonagh rushed to the 1-yard line, but after short gain that he had an incomplete pass, Adams was stopped (by Zack Wagenmann) for a 1-yard loss, and then McDonagh was stopped at the 1-yard line on a tackle by Alex Bienemann and Wagenmann, and PSU was once again denied any points.

Van and Canada both had 100-plus yard rushing games. Van gained a career-high 136 yards and Canada gained 102.

Johnson was 12-of-24-0 for 203 yards and 4 touchdowns. Pierson had 3 catches – all three went for TDs.

Tripp had a game-high 10 tackles, a TFL, and the fumble recovery for the TD. Linebacker Brock Coyle and end Derek Crittenden had 9 tackles apiece. Goodwin had 2 interceptions and will remain among the FCS leaders in pass break-ups, as he had 7 PDs to go along with 3 tackles.

Adams rushed 18 times for 79 yards. McDonagh was 18-of-32-2 for 266 yards and two scores, and held to 13 yards rushing on just six attempts. PSU receiver Victor Dean, a 6-6 junior, had 4 grabs for 118 yards and 2 TDs.

MONTANA 42, At UC DAVIS 7

DAVIS, CALIF. -- Halfback Jordan Canada rushed for two touchdowns and wide receiver Ellis Henderson had two scoring receptions, and the defense was stellar, as the Grizzlies defeated UC Davis in a homecoming contest in Aggie Stadium in a Big Sky Conference game.

The victory improved the 10th/11th-ranked Grizzlies to 2-1 in the Big Sky and 5-1 overall, while the Aggies are now 2-1 in the conference and 2-5 on the season.

Canada, who rushed 24 times for 126 yards, went over the 100-yard mark for the fourth time this season and the sixth time in his career. Canada now has 19 career rushing touchdowns, which moves him up to seventh in UM history.

Henderson had 3 catches for 63 yards and two touchdowns. Griz junior quarterback Jordan Johnson was 12-of-20-0 for 163 yards and 2 TDs. Johnson's two touchdown throws today give him 38 in his career, tying for the eighth most in school history with Andrew Selle (2007-10) and Marty Mornhinweg (1980-85).

It was an impressive game by the Grizzlies on both sides of the football. The offense racked up 418 total yards, rushed 51 times for 255 yards and 3 TDs, and picked up 25 first downs. The Grizzlies also executed flawlessly, as they had zero penalties (UCD had four for 29 yards).

Montana's "D" held UC Davis to 237 net yards and 14 first downs, and registered four sacks. The Griz defense also intercepted two passes. Brock Coyle led UM with 7 tackles, while fellow senior linebacker Jordan Tripp added 5 stops, as did sophomore LB Kendrick Van Ackeren. Safety Bo Tully had UM's other interception.

UM junior end Zack Wagenmann had 1.5 sacks, giving him 15 in his career, which ties him with Randy Riley (15, 1993-96) for 13th on the all-time list.

Junior QB Shay Smithwick-Hann had UM's final score on a career-long 41-yard run -- his first career rushing TD, as the Griz took a 42-7 lead with 4:19 left. Griz halfback Travon Van had 11 carries for 59 yards and a touchdown.

The Aggies started the second half with a 9-play, 70-yard scoring drive, as QB Randy Wright scored on a 9-yard run to cut UM's lead to 21-7 at the 10:57 mark of the third quarter, but that would prove to be their only points in the game.

The Griz answered UCD's only score however, as Canada scored on a 1-yard run to give Montana a 21-point (28-7) lead again with 5:10 left in the third. UM added another TD on its next possession, as Canada, alluding several tacklers, raced to a 24-yard TD to put UM ahead 35-7 with 14:48 remaining in the game.

Montana scored in the closing minutes of the first half, as Henderson was on the receiving end of a 21-yard TD pass from Johnson, giving the Griz a 21-0 halftime lead. That late second-quarter scoring grab was set up by a key 3-yard scamper by Johnson on a 4th-and-3 moving the ball to the UCD 21-yard line, and then Johnson hooked up with Henderson on the next play for the touchdown.

The Griz "D" held the Aggies to 88 total yards and three first downs, and picked off two passes in the opening half. UM's offense gained 226 yards and had 15 first downs.

The Grizzlies got on the board first, when Johnson connected with Henderson for a 30-yard TD grab with 10:03 to go in the first, giving UM a 7-0 lead. Montana tacked on another score on its next possession, Van breaking free for an 18-yard touchdown run, giving his team a 14-0 advantage with 5:59 to go in the first stanza.

BIG SKY NOTES (by Jon Kasper, BSC)

THREE UNDEFEATED: The top of the Big Sky standings currently look a lot like the end of the 2012 season standings. Cal Poly, Eastern Washington and Montana State are all 2-0 in conference, the three remaining teams unblemished in league play. **Cal Poly**, EWU and MSU all tied for the 2012 conference title with 7-1 conference records.

BAUMAN UP TO SEVENTH: Northern Arizona senior running back Zach Bauman rushed 27 times for 196 yards and two touchdowns in the Lumberjacks' 39-38 win over Sacramento State. Bauman moved into seventh place on the Big Sky's all-time rushing list, surpassing EWU's Jesse Chatman, who had 4,173 yards from 1999-2001.

OFFENSIVE IGNITERS: Cal Poly's Dano Graves started for the first time this season, leading the Mustangs to a 47-0 win over Weber State. **Graves, a sophomore transfer from Air Force, became the third QB to start for Cal Poly this season.** Graves rushed 17 times for a team-high 116 yards. He also completed 13 of 16 passes for 169 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions.

BENGALS SNAP CONFERENCE SKID: Idaho State snapped a 17-game conference losing streak with a 40-26 home win over Northern Colorado. Idaho State had lost 21 straight to Division I competition dating back to a 50-20 win over UNC in 2011.

KRAMER THIRD IN LEAGUE WINS: ISU coach Mike Kramer won his 55th career conference game, moving him into sole possession of third place on the conference wins list. Nevada's Chris Ault is the all-time leader with 68 wins. NAU coach Jerome Souers has won 57 conference games. **Montana's Don Read is fourth with 54 wins.** Cal Poly's Tim Walsh is in fifth place with 51 conference wins.

EXTRA POINTS: Sacramento State's DeAndre Carter has caught a TD pass in five straight games...EWU's Ronnie Hamlin had a 77-yard interception return for a touchdown in the Eagles' 35-14 win over North Dakota.
