Game 2: vs. Central Washington



Montana hosts the CWU Wildcats
Sept. 6th in home opener

THE GAME: The #4/#5-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies (0-1) play their 2014 home opener, Saturday, Sept. 6, hosting the Central Washington University Wildcats (0-0) in CWU's first game of the year in Washington-Grizzly Stadium (25,217). Kickoff is at 3:37 p.m.

GAME SPONSOR: The Griz-CWU game is sponsored by *Dream Sleep*.

HALL OF FAME GAME: Prior to Saturday's contest UM's two new inductees into the *Grizzly Sports Hall of Fame*, former running backs **Yohance Humphery** (1998-2001) and **Dick Imer** (1953-54), will be introduced at mid-field. The pair will be inducted at a banquet Friday, Sept. 5.

SERIES/LAST MEETING: Montana leads the series 1-0. The first and only meeting was Sept. 27, 2008, as the Grizzlies nipped the Wildcats 38-35, as **Brody McKnight** kicked a 42-yard field goal with one second left to play. (*See add 15 of this release*).

GRIZ RADIO: **Mick Holien** is in his 22nd season as the voice of Griz football and his 30th year overall. **Scott Gurnsey** is in his 17th year serving as the in-booth analyst, while **Greg Sundberg** is the sideline reporter for his fourth season. (*The FB Network is on add 6*).

COWLES MONTANA MEDIA: The Grizzly-Wildcat game will be televised by Cowles Montana Media. **Ron Davis** calls the play-by-play, **Grady Bennett** serves as the analyst, and **Shaun Rainey** is the sideline reporter. It is available on Charter channels 10/510; DirecTV channel 24 and Dish Network channel 17.

LAST WEEK: At Wyoming 17, Montana 12: Montana gave Wyoming everything it wanted in the teams' 2014 opener in its loss to the FBS Cowboys.

POW NOMINEES vs. WYOMING: The offensive pick was quarterback **Jordan Johnson**, who was 24-of-45-0 for 185 yards and a TD. The defensive nominee was junior linebacker **Kendrick Van Ackeren**, from Bellevue, Wash., who had a game and career-high 14 tackles.

CANADA UPDATE: **Canada's** 2,238 career rushing yards moves him up to fourth on the career list. He is also ranked fourth with 29 career scoring runs.

JOHNSON UPDATE: **Johnson** has moved up to eighth in career passing yards with 6,016. He remains fifth in career touchdown throws with 54.

HENDERSON UPDATE: **Henderson** is now 27th in career receiving yards with 1,416, and stayed 10th in career receiving TDs with 16.

WAGENMANN UPDATE: **Wagenmann** moved up to a tie for seventh with safety **Trey Young** in career sacks with 22, and is now eighth in tackles for loss (31.5).

JJ PAYTON WATCH LIST UPDATE: **Johnson**, a 6-1, 195-pound senior from Eugene, Ore., was 24-of-45-0 for 185 yards and a TD, and rushed four times for 13 yards at Wyoming. His 45 attempts last week were a career-high.

WAGS BUCHANAN WATCH LIST UPDATE: **Wagenmann**, a 6-3 1/2, 255-pound senior defensive end from Missoula, had 2 sacks, a PD, and 7 tackles against the Cowboys last week.

WINNING WAYS: Montana has had **27 winning seasons in the past 28 years** (since 1986). The Griz were 10-3 overall last season and finished 6-2 (third) in the Big Sky Conference. UM was ranked eighth in the nation in the *Sports Network* and *FCS Coaches* final polls of the season.

EIGHT MAKE NFL ROSTERS: The Griz had eight players make 2014 NFL rosters. including two rookies : **Brock Coyle** (linebacker, Seahawks) and **Jordan Tripp** (linebacker, Dolphins) (*the complete list is on add 12*). Offensive linemen **Danny Kistler Jr.** (Raiders) and **William Poehls** (Titans), also both rookies, were let go on the final day of cuts.

JOHNSON MOVES UP TO EIGHTH IN CAREER PASSING YARDS: With his 185 yards passing at Wyoming last Saturday, **Johnson** has moved up to eighth in career passing yards at Montana with 6,016, passing **Drew Miller**, who threw for 5,900 yards in two seasons in 1999 and 2000. **Johnson, who is 20-7** as a starter, needs 68 more yards to pass **Marty Mornhinweg** for seventh.

MONTANA HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

Third Year at Montana: 15-10

Mick Delaney is 15-10 overall in two seasons as the head coach at the University of Montana in his third year at UM.

The Grizzlies were 10-3 overall last season, and Coach Delaney was one of five finalists for the Liberty Mutual FCS “Coach of the Year.”

He is in his seventh season overall at Montana. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM’s associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

The veteran mentor began his coaching career in 1964, and the 2014 season will be his 30th coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to UM from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007.

He has been coaching at Montana the past six seasons. Prior to assuming the head coaching position he served as UM’s associate head coach and oversaw the running backs from 2008-11.

While coaching the Griz running backs he was instrumental in the success of Peter Nguyen, who finished his career in 2012 ranked sixth in school history with 1,985 career rushing yards from 2009-11, as well as Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns from 2008-10 and currently plays for the St. Louis Rams.

Former (2003-09) Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008, while former (2010-11) UM mentor Robin Pflugrad retained him as he was the lone holdover from Hauck’s staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the *Doak Walker Award* as the nation’s most outstanding running back and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 1992. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

He began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under Jack Swarhout at UM from 1967-68, and was also the head wrestling coach at Montana at that time.

He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-77) where he taught English and was an assistant and football coach (1974-77) and also served as the head wrestling coach. He was also an assistant track and field coach.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the UM-Western Sports Hall of Fame. In 1972 he was named the Wrestling Coach of the Year by the Montana Coaches Association, and in 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He has been a member of the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-present.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren. His grandson, Mick, is a redshirt safety this season at UM.

COACH DELANEY RADIO & TV SHOWS: The “**Mick Delaney Radio Show**” hosted by the “Voice of the Grizzlies,” **Mick Holien**, airs every Tuesday at 6:00 pm on Montana’s statewide Grizzly Football Radio Network. The show is hosted by Brooks & Brown, located in the Holiday Inn in downtown Missoula.

The **Grizzly Sports Report** weekly TV show airs on ABC-FOX Montana. The half-hour show airs every Monday during the season, and begins at 10:30 p.m. (Mtn.) in Montana after the local news in Missoula, Billings, Bozeman, Butte, Great Falls, Helena, and Kalispell, and at 10:30 p.m. (Mtn.) on SWX in Spokane. It is hosted by ABC-FOX Sports Director **Dominic Shelden**, and features interviews with Coach Delaney and a player every week, as well as mic’d up segments featuring the Griz coaching staff at practice. It also airs every Friday at 4:30 pm (Mtn.) on **Altitude**.

QUOTING HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

ON THE WYOMING GAME: “When you go on a trip like that and play an FBS school, the feedback immediately, is oh well, you played well, that’s a big school and all that kind of stuff. We went there to win the game and we put ourselves in a position to win it, and didn’t get that done, which was very disappointing.

“We’ve got to regroup, which we started yesterday (Sunday), and take all of the positives -- which there were very many -- out of that game; and start to clean up the negatives. I’ve got to coach better; the coaches have to coach better; and the players have to play better.”

ON THE WILDCATS: “It’s a good program. It’s really an unknown for us this year, because they did not open their season last weekend and they have a new coaching staff. Our coaches have done a lot of homework on what they are going to do offensively and defensively. Kind of like a week ago, you have to go back to their backgrounds and see what they ran.

“We’re kind of expecting a little bit of different defensive philosophy. Offensively, the coach came from St. Cloud, and they were a tempo, no-huddle type of a team, so that’s what we’re expecting on that side of the football. As last week, you have to look at last year’s tape to evaluate personnel and see what match-ups they are going to try to get, and see what match-ups we can get. It’s kind of an unknown. As every week, it’s not so much about them as it is about us, getting back home and getting our feet on the ground, and getting ready to finish the job.”

ON THE GRIZ: “The biggest positive is that we played really well on defense (at Wyoming) for the most part, at least 95 percent of the game. We were very solid on defense. We tackled well. We ran to the ball well. They were a power-run team, and we kept that pretty much under control other than maybe one drive.

“They (the Cowboys) didn’t throw the ball very well, so we weren’t tested there, and I know that we will. All the way down the road we will probably face quarterbacks that will be a lot better throwers than that young man. I don’t know if we will face anybody that runs the ball better than they do, because that’s their trademark and their bread-and-butter.

“Offensively we had a couple of explosives (long plays). We have to figure out a way to run the football. We have to be able to do that. That’s the big thing right now. We are not the type of team that can throw the ball 40 or 45 times a game.”

That mark was surpassed last Saturday as North Dakota State won its 25th straight game, downing Iowa State 34-14. **Montana won their final 14 games of the 2001 season en route to the national championship. The Grizzlies opened the 2002 season with 10 consecutive wins, before the streak ended with a loss at Eastern Washington.** NDSU, the three-time defending FCS champs, will bring its winning streak to Ogden, Utah, to face Weber State on Saturday.

GOOD CALL SPORTS NETWORK: Southern Utah's James Cowser and **Montana's Zack Wagenmann** were both named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List prior to the season by the Sports Network. Both defensive ends showed why last Saturday. Cowser, a junior, recorded 11 tackles and two sacks in Southern Utah's 28-19 loss to Nevada. **Wagenmann registered seven tackles with two sacks and broke up a pass in Montana's 17-12 loss to Wyoming.**

EXTRA POINTS: Idaho State's Xavier Finney rushed for 133 yards in the Bengals' loss to Utah...EWU's Kendrick Bourne has caught two TD passes in both of the Eagles' wins...**Montana leads the nation with six sacks after the first full week...**EWU rested starters Cooper Kupp, Quincy Forte, Ronnie Hamlin and Jase Butorac against UM-Western. All four are expected to play against Washington... Weber State's Zach Smith rushed for a career-high 128 yards and scored on a 60-yard run against Arizona State...Sacramento State's 49-13 win over Incarnate Word was its largest margin of victory since a 69-19 win over Saint Mary's in 2003...Sac QB Garrett Safron threw five TD passes in the win, and he has now thrown four or more TD passes six times in his career, and three times in the last five games... Southern Utah's Raysean Pringle, who went by Raysean Martin last season, rushed five times for 95 yards and scored on a 71-yard TD in the Thunderbirds' loss to Nevada...North Dakota freshman kicker Reid Taubenheim booted a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter -- his first career collegiate attempt...Portland State reserve QB Paris Penn rushed for a career-high 112 yards and scored on runs of 58 and 11 yards against Oregon State...Senior LB Nick Dzubnar tallied a team-high 12 tackles for Cal Poly in a loss to New Mexico State...Saturday's schedule will be the largest in Big Sky history. It marks the first time that all 13 teams are playing non-conference games on the same day. The Big Sky expanded to 13 football teams in 2012.

At WYOMING 17, MONTANA 12

LARAMIE, WYOMING – Montana gave Wyoming everything it wanted in the teams' 2014 opener and had to endure two long delays due to lightning strikes which lasted a total of 57 minutes, losing 17-12 to the FBS Cowboys in front of 25,243 fans in UW's Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium.

The game's second lightning strike delay came with 13:28 to play and lasted 32 minutes, while the first came with about 12 minutes remaining in the halftime break, and it took 25 minutes. The game lasted a total of four hours and three minutes.

The Griz made a run at the Cowboys late in the game, as quarterback Jordan Johnson threw a 16-yard TD pass to tight end Mike Ralston, cutting Wyoming's lead to 17-12. After the Johnson-to-Ralston TD hook-up, UM's two-point conversion try failed, and the Griz trailed by five points (17-12) with 8:20 left to play.

The Cowboys went ahead 10-6 and took the lead for good with 5:10 to go in the third quarter on a 5-yard scoring run by junior halfback Shaun Wick. Wyoming upped its lead to 17-6 with 2:11 to go in the third period, when halfback C.J. May scored on a 58-yard run.

UM took a 6-3 lead with 11:28 to go in that period on a 26-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Burke to fellow wide receiver Josh Janssen on an end-around play.

Janssen's first career catch and TD was set up by a sack and a forced fumble of UW quarterback Colby Kirkegaard by Griz defensive end Tyrone Holmes, and that fumble was recovered by tackle Trevor Rehm, giving UM possession on its own 36-yard line.

UW got on the board first and scored the only points in the opening quarter on their first possession, a 12-play, 57-yard drive that took 5:59, and culminated it with a 41-yard field goal by senior kicker Stuart Williams. That made the score 3-0 UW at 7:17 left in the first quarter.

Wyoming had a chance to regain the lead in the second stanza when Eric Nrzeocha blocked a punt by UM's Stephen Shaw, which was recovered by Brian Hill on Montana's 9-yard line with 2:09 to go until intermission. However the drive was halted when Griz junior linebacker Jeremiah Kose intercepted Kirkegaard's pass in the end zone.

Both defenses were stellar, as the Cowboys were limited to 301 total yards on 67 plays and the Grizzlies had 253 yards on 65 plays. Wyoming ended up with 17 first downs, to UM's 12.

The Cowboys rushed for 209 yards, while the Grizzlies gained 42. Wyoming had an edge in time of possession of 34:54 to 25:04.

Halfback/receiver Travon Van had a career-high 9 catches for 66 yards. Wide receiver Ellis Henderson had 5 catches for 48 yards.

Johnson completed 24-of 45 passes for 185 yards and one touchdown.

Linebacker Kendrick Van Ackeren led the Griz with a game and career-high 14 tackles, while safety Matt Hermanson had 11, and junior linebacker Herbert Gamboa added 10. Senior defensive end Zack Wagenmann added 2 sacks and 7 tackles. Kose also had 7 tackles along with a pick.

Kirkegaard was 13-21-1 for 92 yards. Wick rushed 15 times for 100 yards and a TD.

At MONTANA 38, C. WASHINGTON 35

MISSOULA, MT – Redshirt freshman place-kicker Brody McKnight connected on a 42-yard field goal with one second left, as UM edged the upset-minded Wildcats.

It was a battle between two unbeaten teams. The Wildcats, ranked seventh in Division II, entered the game 4-0, while the Grizzlies, ranked fourth in the FCS came in at 3-0.

The win gave Montana a 4-0 start for the second year in a row. The last Griz teams to accomplish that were the 1969 and 1970 squads.

Montana extended its school and Big Sky Conference records by winning its 25th straight regular season game. Since opening the 2006 season with a loss to Iowa, Montana has won 25 straight regular-season games (10 in 2006, 11 in 2007 and four this season). UM broke the previous Big Sky mark of 23 straight regular-season victories it set from 1969-71.

For the third straight week, the Grizzlies set a Big Sky record for the largest home crowd at a non-conference game, as 25,326 packed the newly-expanded Washington-Grizzly Stadium to watch UM nip CWU. The Griz also set attendance records earlier this year against Southern Utah (25,056) and UC Davis (25,209).

CWU capitalized on five turnovers by Montana, but the visitors from Ellensburg, Wash., also showed a lot of grit, overcoming an 11-point deficit with 7:30 remaining.

The Wildcats cut the Grizzly lead to 35-32, when quarterback Mile Reilly hit wide-out Johnny Spevak for a 56-yard scoring pass with 7:30 to go. A pass from Reilly to tight end Jared Bronson was good for the two-point conversion.

CWU recovered the ensuing on-side kick, and six plays later kicker Garrett Rolsma's 44-yard field goal knotted the score at 35-all with 2:47 left to play.

Starting from their own 35-yard line, UM eked its way down the field, with the key plays, two catches by Mike Ferriter, covering 40 yards. McKnight then nailed the game-winner with one tick left on the clock.

Thanks to a Griz fumble, CWU took an early 7-0 lead on a 32-yard touchdown pass from Reilly to Ryan Dyer. But the Grizzlies made it 7-7 a few minutes later when Bergquist hit tight end Dan Beaudin for a 2-yard touchdown pass.

CWU took a 14-7 lead when linebacker Buddy Wood scooped up a Bergquist fumble and raced 20 yards for a score. CWU took its biggest lead, 21-7, with 8:50 to go until halftime, when Reilly and Bronson hooked up for a 17-yard scoring pass.

Montana rebounded with back-to-back touchdown passes from Bergquist to Marc Mariani of 64 and 42 yards, which tied the score 21-21 with 2:47 left until intermission.

Reynold's first touchdown run, a 12-yarder around left end, came at the 3:05 mark of the third quarter, and was the only scoring in that stanza, setting up the dramatic final 15 minutes.

Bergquist was 25-of-34 for a career-high 377 yards and three touchdowns. Ferriter had a career-high 133 receiving yards and matched his career best with eight receptions, while Mariani had six grabs for 161 yards and two scores.

Reynolds rushed for a career-best 87 yards on 16 carries, and had the first two touchdown-day of his career as well.

Senior safety Colt Anderson had a team-high 10 tackles, while junior linebacker Shawn Lebsock had eight stops.

Reilly, from Kalispell, was 21-of-35-0 for 280 yards and three touchdowns, while Spevak had seven receptions for 136 yards. CWU senior linebacker Chris James had a game-high 15 tackles.
